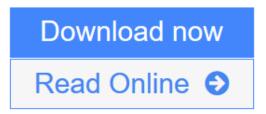

I'm also having a hard time understanding how any other reviewers could say this is 'dragging it out', its 'lack of plot progression' or its 'stereotyped characters'. Unless you define the only plot as Guts vs. Griffith, which to be honest isn't even the most compelling storyline in the series, there's pretty much no way you can define what happens in this volume, especially in the second half, as not progressing the plot.

This volume focuses primarily on Griffith and his war against the Kushan. This automatically brings it down to a four star for me. This is important stuff, but I don't read the series for Griffith. I read it for Guts and Casca and we only get a glimpse of them in this volume. I think some of it might be that a lot needs to be done with Grittith's subplot and the fact that the gang is on a ship. Not much, relatively, can happen on a ship. So important stuff, but I take the volume as a transition volume and don't spend much time on it. The ending of the volume itself is very important and will definitely change the Midlands. Looking forward to more of Guts.

This series has everything. It's intensely dark at times, which is refreshing. It crosses the line you want it to cross. Other stories would turn left and this one turns right. This particular volume is one that just goes batshit crazy and proceeds to make logical sense. A testament to its own paradox.

Miura is insightful. "Because people fear the unknown...They speak the same words to one another...They distrust words they don't understand...They believe in a doctrine...They label outsiders."

And the ramblings of an old man who found meaning in his life portrays the actions around him. It's a sweet, sweet blend with all the right ingredients. Almost every Berserk manga I read leaves me with a sense of awe in some aspect. The art. The story. The method of conveying meaning. The extent of the darkness. The humor.

Berserk is not for the faint of heart, but it is extremely good if you can handle it.

This is the 34th volume in the Berserk series. This volume was mainly a gigantic battle between Griffith's Band of the Hawk and the evil demonic godlike being Ganushka has become. It is revealed that part of Griffith's force are monsters and initially the human members are upset, but they get over it pretty quickly.

Things get really weird towards the end of this volume. Griffith journeys to Ganushka's center and the Skeleton King shows up behind Griffith and attempts to kill Griffith. Instead of hitting Griffith the Skeleton King slices the center of Ganushka open with his sword. Ultimate light spills out from this wound in

Ganushka and Griffith jumps into the wound/ultimate light.

Suddenly mythological creatures are released into the world, supposedly bringing the world of Fantasia to the current world. It was all very bizarre and there was very little dialogue throughout the whole volume; very different from previous Berserk volumes. I am honestly not sure what I think about all of this and where this story is going.

As with previous volumes illustration is well done.

Overall this was a different and intriguing volume in the Berserk series. There is actually very little dialogue throughout, with the majority of scenes being battle scenes. I never thought I would see unicorns in Berserk, but low and behold...here they are. I would recommend this whole manga series to those who enjoy fantasy horror manga.
