Being the youngest in my family, I couldn't take to the lesson of this Serendipity installment as personally as some ("Beinga big brother or sister is a special job"). The way Cosgrove gets there is solid, though. He captures perfectly how confusing it is for kids when they have that first younger sibling because the world is suddenly not all about them and that's weird and they feel like they are somehow wrong or have done something wrong.

The adult cattle were kind of jerks, so I don't know what was going on there. But this is a great thing to give to a kid on the approach of the first younger sibling; beautiful illustrations as ever and a very sweet way to empower the older kid.
