

Anna Wineheart has such a way with words, her writing just ebbs and flows so poetically and naturally, that you just find yourself sucked into the story and amazed by the ending. That's how I feel, anyway, whenever I read any of her stories. This one was no exception - I LOVED Dante and Finn, I cheered for them, I cried for them, and I just AHHHH I loved them.

This takes place in the same universe as The Dragon Boss, and you know what that means! Sentient shopping carts! (Seriously, the locks and the shopping carts and the fact that it's all explained in this story how the metal brings things to life is just all sorts of amazing). This time we get wolf shifters instead of dragon, and I loved the lore of the packs, their concepts of mating, the lines that appeared on Finn, just everything about the world building in this series is excellent.

There is all sorts of yumminess here - we've got age gap - older omega, younger alpha, hurt/comfort and a character with a physical disability, mpreg, knotting, mates, student/teacher dynamics, oh MAN there was so much in this story to love! Anna Wineheart writes amazing age gap and student/teacher type of stories, the ones she has written are some of my all time favorites.

Finn and Dante's romance is so beautiful here, and there's that part near the end (if you've read the story, you know which part) that made my heart break for them. So I liked the first half of this book quite a bit. I liked the idea that Finn knew Dante better than anyone else and had fallen in love with the real man. I liked Finn's loyalty to Dante and their pups in the face of all of the opposition that they were facing. I liked Dante's determination to earn Finn's forgiveness and his love.

And then it's like all of that changed and Finn suddenly lost that loyalty to Dante and he made what I consider to be a very drastic decision on a whim. It pissed me off that this was then merely referred to as them breaking up - IT WAS SO MUCH MORE THAN THAT! I completely lost all respect that I had for Finn's character at that point and I didn't really care if he was ever happy again. I felt that he was just as reprehensible as his mother, and didn't deserve to ever have Dante forgive him. And I don't even want to get started on how evil I think Finn's mother is and how she should be lynched by the pack - certainly not deserving of Dante's efforts to placate her.

There were inconsistencies in the narrative that may have been fixed in the final version, but they paled in comparison to the fact that I came to hate one of the people I was supposed to empathize with. Dante deserved their HEA, and I was glad that it happened for him.

I really enjoy Anna's Alpha/Omega books and this one was no different.

Finn is an omega, living the quiet life teaching woodworking at his home workshop and selling his wares at Market day for extra money. He struggles day to day though with scarring on his leg and stomach from an accident years earlier.

Dante, alpha, is released from prison. He was inside for killing people when he let his wolf take over after losing his omega to the water in an tragic accident. He returns to say goodbye to his omega with the intent of moving on but catches a certain scent.....following it straight to Finn, his omega alive and just as beautiful as always.

Their coming together is hot and heavy as Finn's heat causes more intense reactions to each other. Because of the past, Finn's pack isn't accepting of Dante however and he has a trial period to prove himself worthy. The extra time the get to spend together shows each other love and acceptance as they are regardless of their past and present situation. Though things are never quite that easy.

I really enjoyed this story. The emotion of the situation and what both MC's are feeling about everything come through strongly and it's easy to imagine the highs and lows that they go through in this story. There may have been a tear at the dreaded emotional moment. What is really interesting is the way that the stronger character in age, mentality and maturity is the omega. Finn. He's able to guide Dante through a lot that he;s unsure of and needs help with, especially when it comes to his wolf and the fear they both have of it taking over Dante again and hurting someone.

The setting is beautiful, Anna putting us right there in the forest location of Finn's cabin and the hustle and bustle of people and different things surrounding you at market day. I really liked that there was an aspect of magic mixed in with everything. Finn has carts that are sentient beings and roll around after him, quite amusing to read.

We get a couple of wonderful secondary characters. Finn's brothers surprise him with some support, though conditional. Their biggest supporter however, is Old Bill, one of Finn's closest friends and confidant in the pack.

So, perseverance paid off and I really liked the story arc and conclusion.

Of the two main characters, I sympathized with outsider alpha Dante the most. Finn, his older and scarred partner/former teacher was terribly insecure and his repeated musings about how wrong he was for Dante got a little wearing. This couple had major issues to resolve, some all in their heads and others related to Dante's bad history with Finn's pack and menacing characters surfacing from Dante's recent criminal past. Both of them suffer ostracism and financial hardships as a result of standing together against Dante's detractors, and worry about their uncertain future.

Animated shopping carts and carpentry clamps paired with a feisty pet terrier brought some humor to relieve the sober angst dominating the story. And young Sarah, one of Finn's students, added some priceless zingers! Author Anna Wineheart populated their world with a good number of distinct personalities, some good, some unforgiving or just mean, but neither too few not too many to enhance the main story of the couple's struggle to safely build a family and life together.

Be prepared for some violent bouts, steamy passion, tearful and touching moments with a sprinkling of humor.

Finn and Dante are wolf shifters, both from different packs and very much different in temperament, but very much in love. Finn is 43yo, an omega, an artisan in wood and a teacher of that skill. He teaches both humans and magic folk whereas Dante came to Finn very young as a feral wolf. Dante is now 25yo, having returned to the Topanga pack as an alpha and finding that Finn is not dead but badly injured from what should have ended his life. Will they be able to share the love they feel?

There are so many insecurities in this book. Finn who apparently was beautiful before the accident, now can't stand people ogling him b/c of the scars. And Dante who has murdered people and been made an outcast. It is truly a poignant love story between unlikely people. There is much angst and lots of M/M loving so if that bothers you, don't get this book. The scenes are well-done and the writing is good. My only problem was the length of the book, which I believe could have been shortened and obtained the same result. Could just be me b/c I have so many reviews not done but promised.

This was a wonderful romantic story about Dante and Finn. Dante was beaten and banished from the village he had been staying working as an apprentice / student to Finn.

One day, five years ago, Dante and Finn had an argument on a pier by the ocean. During that argument Finn threw the wooden ring Dante had made for him and in a fit of anger Dante pushed one of Finn's magical carts into the ocean. Finn dove in after it and Dante jump in after to save Finn but never found his beautiful omega.

Broken hearted and having lost the only person he loved, Dante's wolf took over murdering others his pack wanted killed not caring what happened to him. This book is set in the same world as The Dragon Boss. While you don't have to read The Dragon Boss for this book to make sense, but some of the events will help with understanding a bit of Dante's past (and it's a great book).

I think Dante and Finn make a really cute couple. They both have so many scars from their past (both physical and emotional) that it was interesting to see them having to work together to find their confidence and acceptance. Although they certainly don't have an easy path, it only makes the sweet moments all the sweeter. I thought the supporting characters were interesting. Old Bill was probably my favorite, he has a strength that Finn and Dante clearly need. I'm hoping that we'll get some stories with Finn's brothers (and Rhett!) in part just so we can go back and visit with Dante and Finn.

I think the whole living metal is amusing (though it doesn't have quite the dominance in this book as in The Dragon Boss). There has clearly been a lot of thought put into the world-building and the story comes alive from it.

I'm not sure that I really got the whole issue about Finn being Dante's teacher. Finn was Dante's woodworking teacher and though he did have some authority over Dante given the age difference and the age when Dante was first his student, but it just seemed like the characters (especially Finn) was obsessed that Dante had been his students. I ended up finding the constant reminder a bit annoying.
