I can't go on killing people's souls by using my ability.

Serena gets crazy "It seems that you and Sasha have quite a history together,"

Quite a bad bit of luck, him showing up here." "That is unfortunate." realized her story from before was a complete lie, and that if I didn't figure out how to control her, we might end up just like her old Clan. I grappled with a green, burning vapor. What happened to old clan? "They didn't have a proper appreciation for my skills," she said, as if they had offended her by using the wrong fork. "So I conducted a demonstration on the Clan leader's brother, turning him on his own Clan. It got a bit more out of control than I had anticipated, but honestly, they all got what they deserved with that. It was messy, though, and I didn't much care for that. Which was why I left before it was all done. Tricky one, this jacker." She waved the gun at Sasha. "He must have stopped the brother somehow, which even I

couldn't do, not once it was started anyway."

"I'm sorry it turned out this way, Serena." I meant every word. I'd made a terrible mistake with her. "Which way?" Her questioning green eyes flew wide when I shot the dart into her chest. I scrambled to catch her, easing her slowly down, so she wouldn't bang her pretty head on the concrete. sometimes you gotta fire the weapon Sasha twined red and black instinct pre-mindreading psychologist had called it the death drive. I thought of it as an anti-life impulse that lurked every mind, usually muted and buried under that hard ball of pure white survival instinct.

Except in some people, it wasn't buried so deep. I should have known there was something wrong with her when I saw it the first time. The chaos of her mind made a certain amount of sense now: with that death drive close to the surface, warring with her survival instinct, it was a kind of mental self-torture. And I was about to make it worse. I pulled up her death drive, strengthened it, and fashioned a new trigger for it. Every instinct has many triggers: visual cues, sounds, even smells can dredge up an instinctual response from the depths of the mind. For Serena, her death drive would now be sparked by any mental contact with another jacker. It would flare through her other instincts, causing a firestorm that would likely short-circuit her mind. It might drive her insane, and I couldn't be sure that she would survive it, but it would disable her from harming anyone else. And it was better than killing her outright. I really enjoyed The Handler. It's a short story set in the Mindjack world told from the point of view of Julia who we meet in book 2. It shows how frightening and powerful the mindjackers their powers can be and the start of the mindjack revolution. I liked how we get a better feel of Julia and we get a feel for Julian his handling ability. I thought it was very interesting to hear how his ability work and see it form his point of view and I could visualize pretty well how minds must look for him, it was very well written and described.

The story takes place over a short time span, but quite a lot happens in that time and the most important thing is that we get a feel for Julian, his power and a bit of backstory we don't see in the full length novels. We also see a bit of Anna, Sasha and a character we don't see in the novels. I liked learning how Sasha joined the cause.

THE HANDLER is the latest e-novella release (August 2012) in Susan K Quinn's Mindjack series. In a world where mindreading is the norm (due to decades of contaminated water) those without the ability are known as zeroes, but there are a few who possess a power greater than most. The Handler focuses on Julian Navarro and the characters introduced in Closed Hearts and takes place between Open Mind and Closed Hearts before Julian has ever met Kira Moore.

Julian can manipulate the instincts of the mind. Hoping to amass enough people to create an 'army' for the revolution, it is Julian's belief that one day mindjackers would be the dominant species on the planet. But mindjackers came with all sorts of problems and abilities and Julian would meet a few in the early days of the revolution.

Along with his twin sister Anna, Julian would encounter a couple of new recruits that would hopefully become a part of his close circle of mindjacking specialists. But many of the mindjackers coming to New Chicago were forming lawless clans and were not capable of following orders and Julian was determined that Kira Moore, a revolutionary in her own right, would further enhance his stature and presence as a leader.

Julian and Anna would welcome two new recruits, but like most Handlers, the new recruits would have to learn to control their abilities. And it would soon become obvious that one of their recent additions to the Clan, was someone they did not want on their side. With Anna's special ability, the new recruit would be reassigned to a new location and Julian would continue his search for the best mindjackers his Clan required.

THE HANDLER is a quick and easy read that offers some background information into the personalities of some of the characters introduced in a previous storyline. Approximately 3 chapters in length, we become privy to the abilities of the mindjackers and the knowledge that they too, fear the power, that many of their own 'species' have developed. A great addition to the Mindjack series.

The Handler is a short but exciting read, just the right amount and flavor to make my mouth water for more. Even though SF is my favorite genre, I don't give many 5 star ratings. But Susan has created a world of mindreaders vs. mindjackers that keeps me interested in the characters as well as the technology, and she never fails to throw a curve.

I wished I could peek into the mind of this handler, a jacker with the special ability to manipulate emotions, in Closed Hearts. I got the good guy vibe from Julian, but Kira couldn't jack into his mind so I couldn't be sure Susan wasn't going to bait and switch. Anna, Julian's sister, seems a little one-dimensional in this story, but her constant weapons cleaning serves as a good contrast to Julian's character cleaning. He helps recruits clean their souls.

I'm not telling what happens when some new recruits join his clan except to say, expect the unexpected. And if I weren't too old for teams, this novella would have made me declare for team Julian.
