Emily Heart, our heroine, is a high student that is abducted together with her mother, when they are going to church. The abductors ended up killing her mother and she manage to scape. Having her body genetically altered, she now possess abilities that she cannot control. She starts jumping forward in time when she goes over strong emotional stress. Now she is homeless in Phoenix, trying to survive between her jumps in time. One of the most important rule she created is to never get involved with anyone, but she ends up meeting Junie in a homeless shelter. Junie is a young girl that lives in the streets. Emily also meets Derek, another street character, member of a dangerous street gang. One of Emily's new abilities is to sense the real interior goodness of people when they are close to her and she knows that deep inside Derek is a good person. Another character is Jim Miller, a reporter that is following Emily's appearance and has a full folder on her, with photos over a 30 year span showing that she did not age at all during this period. He tries to contact and protect her.

But the abductors did not give up on getting her back and are on her persecution, with highly advanced technology... How will that story end? The author did and incredible job creating a whole plot with his innovative way of exploring time travel. His characters are real, credible, and fully developed, in a way that we start cheering for Emily in every turn of the pages. After-read thoughts:

As said, Glassford girl is a novel, focusing on a favourite subject of mine, time travel - and doing so in a very refreshing manner. This mode of time travel - indeed, time jumping is not as often used as one may think it to be, given all the story opportunities so as a reader I warmly welcomed Emily's ability. The how and the why of the time jumping were not fully explained in this book, but what was given away really spiked my interest and sounded like a intriguing premise. I really wasn't expecting to see those two sci-fi plots, aliens and time travel, collide in this book and was left rather fascinated with this and definitely eager to know more of the alien's background.

The story itself sets a nice pace from the beginning and keeps it till the end. I'd say there were two main characters in the book, teen girl Emily and the reporter Jim Miller, who's been following her "time jumping career" for decades. They were both really nice to read about - I liked how they were ordinary people on the surface, but real fighters inside. I really grew to like them, especially Jim won my heart over with his detremination to become more of what people expected of him. And Emily, well, she is our tough girl. She was forced to grow up quickly. I liked her analytical mind and the way she sorted and planned things. Speaking about the characters, some I didn't like so much. Master Liu for example. What, an old little master to teach our girl everything there's to be? No, please. It is true that it explained Emily's survival abilities but his presense felt so annoyingly out of place. Or Derek. Well, actually, I have nothing against him - he wasn't present that much - but more I disliked Emily's sheepish reaction.

I brought my rating one star down for another reason too. The style was too plain for me to enjoy it fully. The dialogues were fine, but the authors narrative could have been executed better. There were pages where almost every sentence started with "she". She this, she that. The book was fast ans easy to read, but not exactly eloquent.

The novel indeed felt as a "part 1", not "book 1" - it can't be a stand alone read, it felt more like the first part of a greater volume. The story wasn't centered around something or had a straight direction (the gang incident gave me the impression of something happening on the side). Here, this part more let us in the atmosphere of the story, Emily's abilities and bits of background. Some things of supposed importance (like Junie) were left aside, but I guess they will be brought up later on.

As it is now, I'd reccomend this book to younger readers. If with the next books narrative gets richer, I'd probably broaden the audience. But I'd most likely recommend that people read all the parts at once, if they have a chance.
