This was a real stinker of a trade, since I had already read most of it in other places. It collects a couple of the worst Captain America books I have ever read, then the lackluster Avengers Standoff event, then the first two issues of Captain America as an undercover Hydra agent (which I had avoided, because I was rather offended by the idea, personally). It also didn't adequately prepare me for the Secret Empire event, since a lot of other stuff had happened since these issues. I really wouldn't recommend this book, and if you are interested in those stories, I'd recommend reading them separately, since you get more context from reading the preceding and adjacent issues.

By it's nature, it's pretty choppy. And the tone of the books differs with the writers. But, not having read the main event yet, I have to say that this is a brave, brave setup. We'll see how well the real event works.

This is a collection of various Marvel comics that lead up the events of SECRET EMPIRE, including the controversial issue where Captain America reveals he's a sleeper Hydra agent. It also includes some pivotal issues of the AVENGERS: STANDOFF event that provide context for Cap's turn and also the Captain America issues before that where Captain America essentially loses his powers and becomes a member of SHIELD. I would say this is almost essential to read prior to reading SECRET EMPIRE, especially if you aren't familiar with the current Marvel Universe (I wasn't).

Actually this was more like me reading about 40 odd "related" comics. Typical marvel event! Mixed bag of art, storytelling and a strange reading/publishing order.

Some were good, some were pretty pants (X-Men ones were dire).
