Like the previous books there is still an endless addition of new D&D fetish material and even less time spent with any of them. It's more then a little ridiculous at this point, at least to me. Darren did add Taylor a Black Dragon to the cast of under utilized characters which was another character that I want to see spend more time with Vince and evolve there relationship beyond procreation.

The real reason that I liked this story so much, even though all the aspects that make me annoyed are still there, was they he did the one thing I never thought I would do while reading a erotic male power fantasy...
