

Jared is a Duke and his recently acquired Duchess, Patricia, is a little on the wild side, stirring up gossip and being all hoydenish. He's pretty taken with her and he at some point assumed she would make a good duchess. Up til now they've had a pretty standard sex life - darkness, gentleness, pleasure but not passion. So after hauling her away from the theatre one night, he spanks her in the carriage, sees how much she likes it and decides to initiate her into some serious passion.

Patricia in the meantime is in love with her husband and determined that he love her back - so she decides to use her newly taught lessons to make that happen. Jared was kind of a controlling ass, but he wasn't too bad. Patricia was blah. I couldn't understand why he would be so taken with her when he basically never paid attention to her outside of the bedroom. And while I understand that this was a borderline erotica/romance, it really emphasized the romance and love between the characters. My problem however was that their interactions never felt romantic...only sexual. When two characters do not kiss during a sexual episode (repeatedly) then it's just sex to me. Maybe it was the fact that they were already married, the author felt that the kissing part of the wooing was unnecessary, but it just felt like everytime they were going to have sex he rucked up her skirts and laid into her without ever kissing her.
