

First of all, I love novels that can flawlessly shoot from one character's POV to the other. This is what Tracie banister does in Twin Piques; two very different sisters who are also very similar in certain ways. Half way through the novel I found myself wondering just which sister I can relate to the most, that is how well developed the main characters are. Willa, the easy-going optimistic twin and Sloane, the hard-working be it cynical one.

Within a few pages I caught myself laughing out loud or gasping with delight. Within a few chapters I could tell Tracie Banister knows how to deliver a seamless story full of drama, intrigue, romance and laughter. I began to feel excited with each page that I turned.

The tale of Willa and Sloane is FULL of twists and turns which completely surprised me! I thought this novel would be the standard happy-go-lucky 'Chick Lit' with the occasional bumps in the road for the main characters to overcome. I was dead wrong. This is a novel that has you exclaiming out loud 'NO WAY!' and then 'Are you KIDDING me?!' when the next bombshell arises.

Yet among the twists and the heartache there are a handful of touching moments that definitely pull at the heart strings. You end up falling in love with both of the twin's love interests and crave for more when the novel reaches its end. It had me wishing there would be a sequel! A definite read.

Whoa, what can I say? Chick lits had always been one of my favorite genre and this one from Tracie Banister just made me giggly and starry-eyed. I think, sisters Willa and Sloane are the only twins I've encountered in a book who aren't villainous and do not hate each other. Ha ha. Seriously, of all the books I've read before, be it dystopian, or mystery or sci-fi or fantasy, most twins are either pit against each other and one of them is evil and cunning and is out to kill the other one.

Willa and Sloane sure looks similar to each other but that's where the comparison ends. I'm glad they aren't wearing same-styled or same-colored clothes and that they wore their hair differently. Ever heard of a dog whisperer? Well, Willa is more than that. She's a pet psychic. She communicates with animals (mostly dogs and cats) and she understands their feelings, she sees what their emotions convey, she makes sure their needs are met. Others thought her job is baloney, that she's kinda crazy, but the truth is, she's even better than the vet who treats sick pets.

Most of the time, I find myself lost in Willa's world. The way she talks to her dog Cicero and those TV hosts' pets were really convincing. I even thought I was reading a non-fiction book, that there really is someone out there who could interact with animals the way Willa does.

Sloane, on the other hand, deals with finances and threats and embezzlers. She's an enigma. Working as a forensic accountant who investigates fraudulent issues and even those minute details such as questionable

cash withdrawals and gay relationships, she's out to put scammers and swindlers to jail. She's also working her way up to a higher position, and her boss Josh is just too happy to help her (like unbuttoning or unzipping her dress during lunch hours, uh-huh).

These girls got the best of both worlds and I love them a lot. They're both strong characters, funny and smart. Most of the time, they blab a lot (that's one similarity I discover) and they don't pull each other down. Their love interests were also fascinating. Willa meets Brody, a rosarian (a rose doctor in simpler terms) in a TV show and I thought they hit it off. Gavin and Sloane on the other hand keep each other at bay. They do not have any romantic feelings for each other, until.... Thea the Barracuda comes back and Josh the stripper abandons her after he meets their boss's daughter. I am telling you, this book is exciting!

Oh and the best part is? The names of the dogs of bestseller Blythe Summers (Sloan's client) were really cute. Yeah, you'll get to meet Nora Roberts, Jackie Collins, Barbara Taylor Bradford, Nicholas Sparks and Sidney Sheldon in all their furry glory. They had me grinning the whole day! Yay!

The story covers a summer in the lives of two identical twins who couldn't be more different. Pet psychic Willa is all sunshine and happiness. She firmly believes in love and is looking for The One, but mostly she's been looking in the wrong places. (Previously married to a mime? Really? Too funny!) Meanwhile, Sloane can't understand how her sister can believe in happily-ever-after when all men ultimately leave you disappointed and heart-broken. She's so busy working on 2 huge assignments, searching for new clients, and enjoying a no-strings arrangement with a co-worker that she can't see what Willa sees - that their childhood friend Gav, who has moved back into his family home next door to care for his dad, might be the best thing for Sloane.

I really enjoyed spending time with these sisters. I couldn't decide which one I liked better. I think probably most of us can relate to sides of both of their personalities. This was a book about twins (well, duh the title) and hence had a dual POV, a narrative device I am not a big fan of. But am happy to report I loved both of them. Okay, Sloane a teeny-tiny bit more than Willa but that's only because I could relate more to Sloane being grounded and a realist to Willa's dreamy and whimsical nature.

Willa with her pet-psychic abilities and goodness of heart reminded me of the heroine from the 'Enchanted' movie, she was all I could picture the more I read about Willa. Her happy spirit kept the book from slipping into a drama. Despite her flights of fancy she orbited around like a fairy godmother to all the characters, especially to the dogs! It's deserving that her leading man was burnt-by-love man, Brody, a rosarian (all the characters in this book had inventive jobs except for my lady Sloane). Here, Brody feels abandoned and doesn't trust himself to fall in love again due to his past, but it's tough to resist the force of nature that is Willa! Now to Sloane, she's a woman after my own heart. She's tough-as-nails forensic accountant who lives for and relates to numbers, more than people. Not to mention her relationship with Gav, her childhood best friend, confidant and neighbor. All three romantic cliches bundled into one, but the author wonderfully subverts all of this with her effective treatment. Her job was interesting (even a bit investigative), her stubborn nature and her jealous streak - everything was a joy to read. Willa and Sloane are two very different characters, with two very distinct voices. Willa's unwavering optimism becomes the heart of the story in a way that is both inspiring and deeply relatable. I loved that she was legitimately psychic with a genuine ability to communicate with animals that was plausible and realistic, without veering too far into fantasy territory. Willa's idealistic nature was her sword and shield, and it made for a very interesting contrast to her sister's more level-headed and ambitious sensibilities.

Sloane was a more frustrating character, simply because she was more judgmental and cynical than her sister, especially when it came to other women. One of my pet peeves in women's fiction is gratuitous girlhate, but these moments were grounded in the character work the author had done with Sloane. Willa may be the heart, but Sloane is the one on the emotional journey. Banister does an excellent job of depicting her heartache and feelings of abandonment, using the character's past to explore her current relationships.

There is also the bonus of getting not just one, but two love stories, each filled with adorable banter and devastating setbacks. There is a raw honesty to Banister's more emotional scenes, especially between Sloane and Gav, that gives the reader a true sense of what was at stake for the characters. Banister isn't afraid to allow her characters to behave poorly or selfishly and what's even more surprising is she holds them accountable for their bad behaviour. I was fully invested in these characters and rooting for them the entire time.

I would love to see this become a series with Willa and Sloane teaming up again.

I loved this romantic comedy by Tracie Banister. Twin Piques is a fabulously fun novel filled with humor, life and romance. I was literally laughing from page one! Within the pages of this novel, Tracie created a lively world and highly entertaining story. I have to admit, this is a difficult review for me to write, but not because I didn't like it, but rather, because I LOVED this book! It's always more difficult to write reviews for the books that I really really loved, because I want to do justice to the story and articulate why I enjoyed the story and why it's a must-read. I'll do my best to let you know why I loved it!

Living in San Francisco, twins Sloane and Willa Tobin are like night and day. Sloane is a sleek, organized, and professional forensic accountant while Willa is a sweet, artistic, and eccentric free-spirit that makes a living as a pet psychic working with dogs and cats. As different as these two girls are, they are both extremely good at what they do and they both love their job dearly.

The only thing that the sisters have in common besides loving their prospective careers, is their next-door neighbor and friend of more than twenty-five years, Gavin. They might have surprisingly different relationships with him, but he's a wonderful and hilarious constant in their lives. I loved the way that the different relationships throughout this novel were introduced, developed and escalated.

There was a lot of laughter on my end and I thoroughly enjoyed every minute spent reading this novel. The twins aren't the stereotypical personalities that one might assume when reading what they do for work. Willa is a free-spirit, but she's not an airhead. Sloane is a professional bad-ass but she's not a hard-ass bitch. They are both extremely different, yet I found myself wishing I had friends exactly like them both in my life.

I had never heard of or knew what a forensic accountant does and was excited to not only be introduced to something new, but for it to be relevant in my life outside of reading.
