Where do we start... First of all, this book hints at smut. But it's YA. Or YA(wn) as I've dubbed it. Yes I have. Move on. What really messed with my patience, was the constant POV shifting. For such a short story, pick a point of view and stick to it! If you need to tell the story from more than one side, there's that nifty thing called 3rd POV where you can jump from character to character without breaking up the writing and annoying your readers. Also, that way you avoid the "chapters" of only 3 paragraphs...

For such a short story, I didn't like the overly described movements. It's sufficient to say "...she locked the door and went downstairs." No need to spend a whole paragraph to say what can be said in a sentence. It just makes your story read like badly written fan fiction. And no, do not point out that a sentence can fill a whole paragraph. I know it can, and you know what I mean.

The way the author describes Aura, is not flattering. How many times do I have to read about her "ample curves" and how much Jonas likes her fat self? She's fat, I get it. So am I. Move on!

The word vomit to "explain" Aura's "ample curves" was nothing short of trying to explain to the "thin, dumb people who do not know how it is to be fat" that being fat also can be a medical condition, not just cause someone stuffs their face.
