The second installment of The Chronicles of Guiamo Durmius Stolo. At the end of the fist episode our hero has had some basic training but has become increasingly restless and in order to further his quest he signs up to join Caesars army. His first task is to sail to Britain but on landing Caesars army is unsuccessful and has to abandon his invasion attempt leaving behind Guiamo.

The author takes us on a page turning adventure with excellent myths and legends thrown in. The descriptions and situations are expertly described and you feel is if you are right there fighting and combating the evil spirits, carrying his secret weapons and whispering the spells in order from him to achieve greatness and triumph.

This story holds a lot of research and historical facts and the authors knowledge really shines through which holds and captivates the reader into imagining the creatures, people and the way they live and their will to survive.

The extraordinary element is having read the first installment I didn't think the follow up was going to be as enthralling or as good but how wrong was I. I am certainly looking forward with great excitement to the third book.

If you love and I mean love a novel which can take you to a time you didn't live in and bring it to life then this story and the author is for you.

The writers style of writing is simple and with excellently references in the book to the ancient language used, the plot with mythical creatures with dark secrets will appeal to readers of all ages and especially to those of you who like to read a bedroom story to their children (but be warned you could be reading for a long time).

The adventures of Guiamo continue! This book starts with Guiamo landing in Albion with Caesar's ships. He wanted to conduct business there so he went as part of Caesar's army with his good friend Ursius and the dogs. One day, while out with the Roman army, Guiamo became very sick and fainted. In the meantime, the rest of the Romans he was with were ambushed and their bodies were burned. Finding no survivors, Guiamo was presumed dead. We find out he's still alive and is taken before King Eterlam, who gives him a new name (Cuomoro). The King is suspicious of Guiamo and ready to put him to death but with the help of his sword, Guiamo's life is spared and he tells the King his story. When the King realizes how powerful Guiamo is, he allows his training to continue but he is not able to return to the Romans.

There's a lot of fighting in this book and Guiamo is able to employ new strategies and gain the respect of the men around him. In one of the battles, something strange happens with his sword and he is able to learn more about the history behind his sword. The book felt like it wrapped up pretty well but the ending definitely left me ready for the next adventure!

These are not quick, light easy reads. They are so interesting, though, and worth reading for the rich storytelling and history they contain. The author has definitely done his research. I like the way certain details are brought back into the story later on so I feel that every part of the story is significant. I also love what I'm learning from Guiamo's character and how he deals with the situations he finds himself in. This is a time period I'm not familiar with and I'm enjoying learning more about it through such an interesting character.

My only complaint is that I wish there was a Cast of Characters that I could refer to when I forget who someone is. There are lots of unfamiliar names and terms (which there is a Glossary for in the back) and it can take a while for me to figure out what's going on or remember who a certain person is. If you enjoy historical fiction, this is a series that is definitely worth reading! If you've never read historical fiction, this series will make you a fan!

Cumoro, the second volume of The Chronicles of Guiamo Durmius Stolo Series continues the wonderful adventures of the young Guiamo in the entrancing anciently world. If in the first book we had a fresco of Roman life during the Republic period strewn with historical events, now we will reach the mirifical world of fantasy. The true historical moments will be much less being only the trigger for our hero's new adventures.

To put spurs to your imagination, the author will make a 180 degree turn in the story flow and the real will be replaced by the imaginary. The world in which Caesar was the law begins to resemble more and more to the bygone Greek legends, the old heroes' times when the bound between the realm of the gods and the human's was more permeable. But no the gods or other legendary characters of the Greco-Roman world will ignite the pages, but the Celtic mythology ones because the set for the second volume of the series will be the dark and mystical world, literally and figuratively, of the old Albion.

Young Guiamo will arrive in Britannia with the first Roman invasion of the island, that of Caesar in 55 B.C. Through an unfortunate combination of circumstances for him, but that will prove to be auspicious for the inhabitants of those places, Guiamo will find himself quite quickly caught up in a new conflict at a totally different caliber. The little Caesar's escapade will prove to have been only a trivial firework compared to the warfare that was taking place between local tribes and the terrible forces of Darkness. Of course, the inventive and brilliant Guiamo as we know him and a bit more mature, will not give back to the new challenges. Assuming the new situation and recognizing in it the words of the oracle, Guiamo will rise again to the situation with the imagination and determination showed in the first volume.

What this volume brings extra? Action! Yes, action with a capital A! You will have full pages of atrocious battles, of bloody fights whose outcome will oscillate to one side to the other. There will be no more the elegant and brilliant Caesar's maneuvers that could win a battle like a game of chess. Will be the wild frays of those feral times and places. The way of being and acting of the opponent leaves not too many options. So get ready! Forget about that cute and exuberant kid and meet an unleashed Guiamo and his wrath.

The book's style is the same as in the first volume: fluent and charming. Obviously the tone of this volume will be a little more sober and the funny moments of the first book will not find their place here, but rest assured, you will not lose anything.

I guarantee you will not be disappointed, and if you enjoyed the first volume, this one will make you to read it breathless. As I said to you in the review of the first novel is a welcome reading for young, but that can be read with pleasure at any age.
