When a Russian Mafia princess is spoiled - beware. In this latest book in the series, it is a page turner. This starts off right after the last book. This book does need to be read in order. It is best to read Shadow Play, then Hideaway prior to reading this story because it will make more sense. This three book arc focuses on Cara Delaney and her family. First her sister Jenny appears, then her mother and father's story is revealed. Her grandfather, whom she has never met, is now interested in seeing her. Flown against her will to Russia, Cara walks on eggshells as her mother blackmails her into obedience. Her grandfather is a powerful man who lives by a certain code of ethics. Is it legal? Debatable based on what one consider what is legal and what should not be.

The pace of this tale moves slow at first. As we learn more about Cara's unknown family ties, it is clear that Cara's mother has only one specific interest. The sheer cruelty and negligence from mother to daughter is laid out in high definition. It is appalling, especially when contrasted with how much Eve wants to protect Cara. The ruthlessness in this book is what made it appealing for me. I like how brutal the different factions fight against each other. There are no safe rooms or political correctness here. This is the world where only might makes right. The power struggles and the backstabbing is as expected and chillingly written.

I enjoyed the character development as well as the multi-thread storyline. Ms. Johansen does a marvelous job of weaving together several story lines. This helps move the story along faster as we learn more about the past, present and what the future may hold. Ms. Johansen's storytelling is captivating and each one of the books in this series just gets better and better. The character growth and development of Eve is a pleasure to see. What is more endearing is all the people she has met and how they become part of her circle of friends. This world of Eve's keeps growing and her life is always interesting. The aspect of Eve Duncan's character that drew me to Iris Johansen in the first place was her ability to connect with the person she was attempting to reconstruct. Her chosen profession as a forensic sculptor was interesting and the books followed the medical thriller formula for which I am a big fan.

As of late, however, in perhaps an attempt to evolve the character, the aspects that made Eve unique in a sea of female characters are largely missing from the books. Night and Day is no exception, as Eve spends entirely too much time on her latest search and rescue mission. Nothing about finding Cara sets this book apart from the ones that have come before. Night and Day is the twenty first book in the series by Iris Johansen featuring the character Eve Duncan. This particular story line though began in book nineteen and has been it's own little trilogy within the overall series so I won't give any details directly about this story so I don't spoil it for anyone at this point but just a brief glimpse at the overall plot involved in all three books. This third of the trilogy picks up right at the ending of Hide Away.

Eve Duncan is a forensic sculptor, she gives a face to children who have been found murdered in an effort to try to bring justice to their killers. When she gets a phone call from a sheriff in California she agrees to work on the skull of a 9 year old who begins to speak to Eve as she works. Jenny can't remember much at first but she insists that Eve was meant to help her find out what happened to her. Eve becomes determined to find justice for Jenny and help bring in her killer.

While I've enjoyed reading all three books in this story line the first was definitely my favorite as it was the one that dealt with the forensic side of the case. But all three have been a high intensity action packed ride all involving that first case that Eve started working with. There's a paranormal element added to each of the stories with the first and the third seeming like that was more prominent in the books.

Overall, 3.5 stars, Iris Johansen is definitely a great writer and while I haven't read everything by her I'd

definitely recommend checking out her work from what I have read. If interested in this book you should really go back and start at book nineteen to get the start of the story.
