Ding ding ding!! We have a winner! After reading Alabaster Island (4.5 stars) the author asked me what he would need to do to earn 5 stars from me... This, this is what you do! You write a book like this one. While I liked Alabaster Island, it was good and did keep my attention (4.5 stars is great!) - this one, The Atlantis Twins - was captivating!

There was so much to this story. It was complex and very suspenseful. It had a lot of twists and surprises. There were more than a few times that I gasped out loud. And one time I actually said "Whaat? No way!" Didn't see that one coming!

I expected this to be a YA mermaid book, but despite the main character being a teen, it read much more like an adult thriller.

So, it wasn't what I was expecting to read at all, but it was well-written. Alysa doesn't remember her past other than she lost her twin and needs to find her. As her memories slowly return, it only poses more questions to be answered and the reader is kept guessing about everyone's intentions.

The book ends in a satisfactory way although many questions are left unanswered.
