Who do you turn to when you can't turn to your family? Two Wolf pups who remind me of Pugsly & Wednesday the children from the Addams family. Snobby relatives particularly in rich families. Having few or no friends. Being a Single Dad with all the challenges it entails.

Temptation to cross ethical lines with younger babysitter. Bearly meeking out a living: public transportation, temp jobs - hard labor, having to have several roommates. Overwhelming jobs - emotionally, physically, and too many hours required. Being selfless. Seeing a poor wounded creature in distress and opting to rush him on foot to the nearest vet clinic.

Loving animals but being too poor to even feed oneself daily and refusing to bring an animal into that precarious situation. Love finds a way though it's not easy. The road is full of detours, crater size potholes, and long lonely stretches of highway, where a rest stop could be fraught with danger in addition to snacks & restrooms.

I enjoyed the book but for me there wasn't enough build-up, background or detail sometimes. The book, in a lot of places, felt rushed and like details had been left out...to me anyway. I loved the premise of the story and the May/December feel of the book and feel like it has/had a lot of potential. Ryan is an Omega that is down on his luck because of the societal (and even familial) prejudices of being an Omega. Ryan has a huge heart and meets Gideon when he brings a badly injured dog to the vet hospital where Gideon is the vet. They form a bond over the dog and then eventually over Gideon's son Noah. Gideon has a prestigious career but has "high society" parents that arranged his first marriage and don't approve of Ryan...neither does his brother. Gideon is not your typical alpha in a lot of ways but there are certain times that it just comes out in his attitude and personality.

Ryan is a young man who was kicked out of his house when he presented as an Omega. He lived on the streets for some time, finding odd jobs here and there, which gave him just enough money for a place to live with roommates. Life is a constant struggle for him. He can't seem to catch a break.

One night Ryan comes across a wounded dog in a ditch. The dog looked near death and Ryan did not have the heart to leave the animal alone. He quickly rushes him to the first veterinarian hospital he could find. There he meets the handsome veterinarian, Gideon. It's obvious that Gideon is much older than him and has no business finding him attractive, but something just pulls Ryan to Gideon.

Gideon is surprised to see that the man who brought in the wounded dog is a gorgeous young man. When Officer McKenzie was suspended, why did or characters feel relieved and "that it was over"? I would imagine that it would become more stressful for them because now he would have a vendetta against both Ryan and Gideon. When does a shifter find out if they are alpha or omega? Is it at puberty? Why did Ryan's parents, who had to have been shifters, disown him for being omega? Are male omegas rarer than female omegas? If he was female, would they have felt the same? Why would they have what seems to be a human prejudice/misconception when they aren't human?
