This is THE most FRUSTRATING book I have read this year.

- -The plot goes round and round in circles, repeating itself every other chapter. For example: plot happens in chapter 3...chapters 4 and 5 revolve around Shannon and Johnny relaying said plot in chapter 3 to their friends. NOTHING HAPPENS. It's like 1 step forward and two steps in place. I can literally skip entire chapters and still get the gist of what happens. By like the 40% point, the two main characters have had hardly any interaction- but I know all of the antics of their friends really well! Gibsie is hilarious! Lizzie is a drag. That Rowen character sucks. Gibsie and Claire sooo belong together and are blind to it (I sense the build up to their own book)...etc. The book mostly revolves around Shannon's shitty home life and school life, Johnny's sports and their friends. Which is all fine...except its more about all of those things than a romance. And it doesn't help that so much of the plot is repeated every other chapter.
- -There is slow burn romance....and then there is so slow, they literally go backwards- romance. The main characters have maybe 5/6 worthwhile scenes together and I am at the 72% mark. They talk the day Johnny hit Shannon in the head with a ball, they talk maybe once at lunch, they talk when she is forced to go over to his house twice, they have one meaningful conversation in his car and they go to a pub together. But most of their conversations revolve around him trying to figure out what the marks on her body are from, and kicking the asses of those who threaten her. They have kissed once (one sided mind you), talked a handful of times, yet they both feel like they are in love with the other. HOW?
- -I get Shannon is a wounded bird- but MAN her actions are frustrating to read. She's just SO meek and the ultimate damsel that needs saving. *Everything* bad that could happen to her, happens to her. It's just a lot. And I get that she has had a hard life, but sometimes I just really wanted her to stand up and become a strong person despite all of that.
- -Although I am giving this a one star out of pure frustration with the plot-I do have to say that the dialogue is this book is fantastic and it is pretty well written in general.

I'm not going to rehash anything that happened in this book because you can get that from the blurb... but this story is not your typical teenage angst drama with the standard hot and cold, back and forth plot line dealing with the romantic relationship of the main characters. That kind of story line has been played out so many times and to be honest, I'm so over it.

It's hard for me to put into words, but Binding 13 didn't even feel like a story. It felt like real life that I had a front row seat to witness. Everything was so gradual but hooks you from the very first page. It's a slow burn, one that heated my bones, singed my heart and seared my soul. The innocence, the emotion and the purity of the storytelling, where it is all about the story, was done to perfection, but also kept light-hearted with all the hilarity, banter and awkward teenage moments that had me in tears from laughing.

Chloe Walsh has never disappointed with her amazing storytelling skills, her phenomenal writing, characters and her ability to captivate her readers and pull them into her books. And that's exactly what she did here, but added so much more depth and raw emotion than she ever has before. She created a whole new cast of characters that were so thoroughly fleshed out that you can't help but to submerge yourself into their lives, understand their thoughts and their feelings, and watch them grow day by day. Johnny, Shannon, Gibsie... all of these characters caressed my heart and gave it one hell of a smile. They are definitely unforgettable, especially that little shit Gibsie. That kid was a barrel of laughs and his banter kept this story fun during moments of conflict.

Ever so slowly, Johnny brings her out of her shell and her character ended up growing the most in this book.

I'll admit, the page count did frighten me at first, but once I started reading I was glued. I actually wanted it to be longer, but never fear! Review(more likely me babbling about how much this book fucked me up)

Our story stars with Shannon an abused kid who was a victim of extreme bullying in school. You see this is explained in like the first 10 pages of the book and in that 10 pages, I formed a powerful connection with the character. From the get-go, it is established that this character is fragile and already broken. Shannon can't take another day in that school and she breaks down. So, our story starts with the conclusion of a tragic train of events whom deeply scarred Shannon. Small, underweight and having serious anxiety problems Shannon becomes a true representation of what bullying can do to people, especially teenagers.

The book presents a dark and disturbing side of adolesce. Mean girls brought to another level. Insecurities increased by the constant bullying, the wrong depiction o beauty in the modern-day society and the emptiness built into her soul after a life of constant misery. The author managed to portray a character that automatically evokes a need for proving protection, so when the other characters in the book react the same

way you wish to the comportment comes as a given.

Shannon story gets darker and darker with every chapter. Seeing her filled with anxiety provokes the same anxiety to form in your stomach. You tremble with fury, scream with excitement and laugh your ass off. 'Cause this broken character isn't moody, cold and has a bad attitude as a defensive and coping mechanism, this broken character is sweet and funny and makes you all warm on the inside. And because of this, her suffering is even more tragical and heartbreaking. Bullying is an important but fragile subject and here it was done beautifully. In this book, the bullying isn't sugarcoated, neither is it easily overcome. Nor is the bullied character anxiety magically transform and heal. This a real portrayal of the harsh truth of bullying and reading it broke my heart.

But bullying isn't the only problematic subject discussed in the book. Beside Shannon, we have our male protagonist, Johnny, an international rugby star. As with Shannon character the author manages to create a beautiful and real representation of the professional rugby world. The stereotype of the superstar male jock is put under a new light, Johnny's path is filled with expectation, emotional and physical stress, overtraining, invasion of privacy, falsity, manipulation. But above all this, the big weight that is currently pressing on Johnny's shoulders comes from his injury and the threat of missing on his imminent career. The pressure put on his body through his own choices and the expectation that comes with a position like his takes its tools and when his body shuts down on him, well everything goes to shit. Johnny's story is a story of ambition, sacrifice and learning what is more the priorities in your life really are.

Both Shannon and Johnny are strong built characters but when you put them together magic happens. For all the tragic and serious matters of the book, there was a laugh-filled moment or a sweet warming your heart of a stone scene that makes you swoon. And after those moments when tragedy hit again, it would always be so much bitter and worst. Their relationship was sweet and pure. Johnny commitment to protect Shannon give me goosebumps and Shannon innocence didn't fail my swooning heart for a second. Their chemistry was flying off the roof and the love between them seemed almost cosmic, almost as those two damaged in such different ways souls were put there one beside the other to save each other. Their story was simply magical.

The ending broke me. Just that broke. And when I saw the release date for the second book I legit wanted to cry. This book isn't just a good book, this book feels personal to me, dear to my heart and bearer of my dark thoughts. I can't recommend this enough.
