

'Overexposed' works great as a standalone. I haven't yet read the other books in this series, and I didn't have any trouble.

It would be hard not to love both Levi and Thad right off the bat. With the story told from his POV, I could feel Levi's grief every time he thought of his sister. And while Thad's story is revealed more slowly, it was clear from the beginning that he had his own demons that he was dealing with.

The only window we get into Thad's thoughts are a few texts he sends to someone identified only as 'M'. However, those texts were enough to feel how lonely Thad was, and how much being around Levi gave him hope.

Levi and Thad become friends before becoming lovers, which I really liked. It happens slowly, as the two hike the trail and share bits and pieces of themselves with each other. This is one of those books where you really get to *see* the characters fall for each other.

And underneath the slow discovery was a sexual tension that leapt off the pages. The UST was killer! I was anxiously waiting for the two to give in. And once they finally did, it was **hot**.

However, both Thad and Levi have their hang-ups, which almost ruin their budding romance. When it looked like the two might not make it, my heart hurt along with them. But they do pull through, and it's in a spectacularly romantic fashion.

'Overexposed' has it all - two complex and well-developed characters, a sweet and heart-grabbing romance, a fair amount of angst and emotion, and the kind of well-written storytelling that will capture your attention.

Megan Erickson has outdone herself again. She has created two characters and a plot I absolutely adored. Levi and Thad are just amazing for different reasons.

Levi is naturally outgoing, bouncy, bubbly, charming, cute - well, anything you would expect from someone who's a reality TV show celebrity, just that he follows through in real life, too. Not that his time on TV has gone to his head. His normal upbringing has a lot to do with that, with his mum and sister rooting him firmly on the ground. Levi's good-natured chattiness, his 'high maintenance' (view spoiler) and tendencies to act a teeny bit like a drama queen make him utterly endearing, and he just made me SMILE.

He is a genuinely nice guy, so when his sister gets killed in the line of duty he finds it difficult to cope. His way of trying to come to terms with her death is to go on the walk they both had planned before her death. On his own - even if he isn't the most experienced outdoor guy.

Right on day one he notices the tall, dark, brooding guy who seems to be heading the same way as he does, but he doesn't really think about the stranger until he meets him outside his tent in the middle of the night, sitting on a rock and looking at the moon.

What an original way to have two characters meet! Loved that first 'conversation' which is so symptomatic for what follows - Thad barely speaking and Levi babbling excitedly. XD

And yes, then there is Thad. Tall, strong, well-built, with all the gorgeous body hair and the scruff on his cheeks - sigh. So silent, so with-drawn, so blooming mysterious. He is an enigma that Levi wants to solve, wants to find out about more despite Thad's lack of communication skills. I loved the way Megan Erickson lifts the veil of mystery very yery gradually and that by telling the story from Levi's POV only (with the exception of the very cleverly inserted texts between Thad and someone called M) we know as much about Thad as Levi.

Thad appears gruff and rough, and he doesn't speak a lot. He hardly opens up and doesn't give anything about him away for a long time. If you wonder how this can lead to two characters getting together - it works beautifully here! I adored Thad, and although we don't know a lot about him I was pulled towards him, just like Levi. He shows with tiny actions and some of the most romantic lines I have ever read in m/m romance what kind of person he is.

Or when he says things like:

"I'm not looking at the moon right now, Le," he said. "I'm looking at you. Those gorgeous eyes. Those lips. That body. You're the moon I get to see during the day."

Argh - I turned into huge puddles of goo when he came out with stuff like that! The main thing is that Levi can see who Thad is despite his quiet demeanour (and Thad opening up more in the second half of the book helps too)

More sighs and ahhhs and tear-wiping. Riiiiiighht.

Of course all Thad's mystery comes with a secret that's pretty much soul-destroying for Levi when it's finally revealed. I was in tears when I found out. Argh. Beautifully done, Ms. Erickson. Beautiful anguish!

But in the end the two of them fit, whatever, and I can't help quoting this again, simply because it is just wonderful.

(Thad:) "I'm not perfect."

(Levi) "I don't want you to be perfect. Perfect's boring. But you're prefect for me. You fill all of my cracks, all the places where I'm not whole. I can only hope I do the same for you." "You do. You so do."

Levi stumbles upon Thad a few days into his hike.

Thad is a quiet, with a hard body and intense eyes man who tries to find who he really is and like Levi what

he wants to do with his life . Thad is closed off, but all Levi wants from the moment they meet is to find out everything about the mysterious man. When the two men agree to hike together, their connection becomes stronger with each and every day, but what will happen when Levi will discover the truth about what Thad is hiking to escape?

Where do I even begin with this book?! I thought it was going to be hard to top Trust the Focus, but damn this one managed to inch just a little bit deeper into my heart.

Levi and Thad are both on the Appalachian Trail to look deeper within themselves.

Levi needs to grieve the death of his sister Layla, move on from his reality TV life and figure out where his place is in the world.

Thad, similarly, has also lost his identity. He's looking to find the man he truly is and more importantly, the man he wants to be.

Levi stumbles upon Thad a few days into his hike. It's the middle of the night and he spots Thad sitting on a rock, gazing up at the moon. Thad notices Levi, quietly appraises him and simply scoots over to make room for him on the rock. And just like that, the two form an effortless companionship centered on a mutual respect and understanding that this isn't just a bucket list adventure for either man.

Thad is quiet and introspective, while Levi is more outgoing and social. Thad doesn't say any more words than are necessary, and Levi finds comfort and security in Thad's careful conversations. But it's clear to see that the feeling is mutual, and that Levi's chatter and stories calm something inside of Thad.

Their attraction to one another is constantly bubbling below the surface, and the sexual tension between these two grows as their time together on the trail goes on, until one night where the chemistry can no longer be denied.

But can Thad, who's accustomed to being guarded and stoic, handle the growing emotion that consumes him? What happens when a secret is revealed that rocks Levi to his core? But more importantly, what happens when they reach the end of the trail?
