

I really liked this book. It's set in the future, where Emma, the heroine, grows up. In this dystopian society, during the Acquisition, the children are either classified as Endorsed or not. And, if you are not chosen to be an Endorsed, you are ripped apart, literally kidnapped, from what you've known your entire life, from your family and friends, and moved to live in the Barren, where you will be trained to be a servant of the elite in the Assembly. What I liked about Emma was her strong relationship with her friends. Beckett and Carter were great characters, especially Beckett. He's so cute :). And her relationship with Finn, even though it seemed to progress a little too fast, it was still a cute love story. Emma's story is mostly about trying to find out why her life seems to be in danger since she arrived in the Barren, and what happened emotionally between her family and herself, while trying to be an individual in the Harvest, a severe society where self-expression is very dangerous. This was an okay read with an intriguing premise. It started out quite promising and, then somewhere near the middle, it became a little *meh* for me. I found some of the dialogue and interactions between Finn and Emma juvenile and cringe-worthy. I couldn't really feel a solid connection between them and thought their "romance" was weak and unbelievable.

And, for a supposedly very strict, regimented society in which the Steriles were severely restricted in what they could do and say, Emma seemed to be able to get away with an awful lot of rebellious behaviour that would have no doubt condemned another Sterile to arrest and prison. I'm afraid I failed to see what made her

so special and an exception to the rules.

Nevertheless, there were some pluses to the book and most of the characters were quite well developed and likeable. Carter and Beckett were good friends to Emma and it was nice to see Emma reciprocate by trying to protect them and staying loyal to them. The negative, toxic influence of Finn's uncle and mother as he was growing up no doubt played a big role in his somewhat jaded personality, and I found myself disliking him more than liking him throughout the whole book. But, he did redeem himself somewhat near the end and subsequent books will probably change my opinion of him.

For the most part, I liked the book, but it didn't blow me away. However, I'm intrigued enough to see what happens next as a result of Emma's decision at the end.

A solid first YA novel (my assumption is that it is a first). There are a couple of holes in the plot, but nothing that causes the book to fall apart. Mostly things that I blame on the editor more than the author.

The premise is intriguing, and the author does an excellent job if giving away just enough to keep you wondering what's going to happen. However, I felt that some of the character development happened a little too quickly. If the story had simply been laid out to occur over a longer time period (most of it happens in 2 two week chunks about a year(?) apart) then I think I could have been better able to swallow certain emotional developments. As it is, the main character is presented as battle-beaten, hard-headed, hard hearted, emotionally distant and quick-to-become-attached all at the same time.

It was a nice quick read and I'll probably read the second one, if I get the chance.
