I do love it when I pick up a book with little knowledge and therefore few expectations other than I hope I enjoy it, only to discover that I'm bowled over by the characters and plot.

I immediately enjoyed Mags' character, the protagonist. She is somewhat similar to other heroines of urban fantasy; feisty, ballsy, attractive and overall pretty bad-ass. I have no issues with this at all. That's one of the main reasons why I love female leads in this genre. What Olivia Martinez offers, however, through the creation of her character, is a new type of supe. And a pretty cool one at that!

The first thought when I found the book was: Hmm, a jinn! Finally a paranormal book NOT based on Vampires, Werewolves, Mermaids or Ghosts, the most common ones in the market. I picked it up and read it, finishing it within 24 hours.

The main female character, Mags, is a perfect heroine, with just the right amount of humor, sarcasm and action filling the pages. The story moves smoothly and you will easily settle down into the pace of the story. The backstory of Mags has been explained in a perfectly appropriate way so that the flow never breaks. The only problem with Mags was that she didn't used her brain much and many revelations could be easily induced by the surrounding events. I mean (view spoiler) That is not what exactly happens but is close enough. The first twenty chapters of the story proceed in this way through Mags narration. But the start of the twenty-first chapter begins to uncover most of the hidden secrets there were throughout the story, in which one I didn't expect and later, the POV switches to Luc and another, and a different type of, jinn Haliz who continue the story after the point where Mags leaves the role of narrator. The last six chapter are the reason this book got four stars from me. The story ends so well that I can barely wait for the next book in the series. If the author makes small changes to the characters, this book has the potential to become one of my favorites of all time.

Told in a pleasing voice with great personality and humor, Olivia Martinez's Mistfall builds from a premise that's intriguing and thought provoking, whatever (if any) your faith.
