

The suspects: Mrs. White, Mr. Green, Mrs. Peacock, Professor Plum, Miss Scarlet, and Colonel Mustard. Who did it, and who is innocent? Mr. Boddy is counting on you to put the facts together and get to the bottom of this mess.

The mysteries, for the most part, are set up well and require some thought and some looking back over the text. However, the writing is so poor I find it hard to be motivated to figure the mystery out. The answer is on the next page, so I'm not left wondering. I did notice one of the answers they had didn't work with the facts given, but the rest all seemed fine.

I still can't believe how bad the writing is. It's geared towards younger readers, yes, but that's no excuse. I won't be reading any more of these books, nor am I keeping a copy of this book.
