with spoilers DPisms abound but don't overwhelm. Maybe it was the shorter length but the story holds on well enough. We have a temporarily disabled barrel racing h who has money/management problems on her small ranch, and a citified cowboy H who heads a computer company and has a teenage daughter with his former wife. He sees improving her ranch as a temporary distraction and a charity case as well and so takes on the job of the accountant at the ranch without disclosing his real status. The revelations of his dishonesty leads to the climactic problems.

I like this DP h - so strong and independent and gives him back good too - for most parts at least! So we have a secondary ow to say the usual

"Marriage isn't everything," Jane said. "You might become the head of your corporation."

"Anything's possible. But I have a secret, sinful hunger for dirty dishes and ironing a man's shirts and having babies. Shameful, isn't it? Don't tell anyone."

*"You closet housewife, you!" *eyeroll**

And of course, the ubiquitous chest rubbing scene merits another eyeroll.

I like the reason why she refuses to have sex with him again - not because of the usual guilt/shame but because of the casual way he leaves her bed after the act. That resonated with me as a woman.

I also had issues with his ILY declaration as it was hardly worth anything as his stand on marriage and commitment remained the same - affair yes, marriage no!

And the primary ow - the ex-wife does her job well but I am not a fan of DP's way of redeeming ow. And I **don't** want the ow to be the topic of post-coital conversation on h/H honeymoons.

Oh well, all said and done I liked this book!
