

And if these are Les Petits Fairytales and not Disney, why is the girl obsessed with books and wearing a yellow dress? I guess technically that would be a reference back to Robin McKinley's "Beauty: A Retelling of Beauty and the Beast" but if you are calling your story Les Petits Fairytales could we please stick to the original french source material.

Disney is NOT source material.

I did appreciate the use of the word "marriage" at the end of the book instead of wedding. Beauty and the Beast "get married" they don't "have a wedding".

I like that there is only one word per page, so I can embellish the story if I want or keep it simple.

Once there was a beautiful girl who had to live with a purple beast after her father stole a rose from the Beast's garden. After a while they more or less fell in love, and then they were married by a squirrel.

Another so-so fairy tale adaptation in this Let Petits Fairytales series. Again, it's funny how some clearly Disney influences are present, even though they're ostensibly trying to present a story more faithful to the original. Same odd vocabulary choices, same adequate artwork.

The illustrations are really cute but, this is not as great a series as the one from Jennifer Adams. It's a little over simplified for me. This is definitely a book for babies.
