Driven by his passion, Van Gogh, who died young in 1890 at the age of 37, lived for his work only. His ability to observe nature and life, to perceive the different qualities of light and the fine gradation of colours, were the basis of his paintings. Van Gogh, lived in great poverty, supported only by his brother Theo. The special, deep bonding between the two brothers was so deep that shortly after Vincent died, Theo, broken by grief, began to have hallucinations and severe headaches. He died only 6 months after Vincent.
