The Sacrifice definitely takes a step up from The Unintended and The Nexus in a few places.

1. Perceptions of characters from the first two books are required to be challenged in more serious ways. In my TV shows, movies, and books, I like characters that live in grayscale, instead of just being so cut and dry, black and white. Woods did a great job in challenging my perception of a character I had imagined to be the absolute incarnation of Satan himself. So good.
2. The story doesn't stay in the realm of a little fight here and there. As the main character finds herself getting deeper and deeper into this supernatural world, the conflicts she becomes involved in get more complex and dangerous, as well. The jump in action was big, but the progression seemed natural.
3. As the main character gets more mature, her decisions get more adult. This book definitely has sexier elements to it. With danger and mystery come awakening of other desires, and that is explored in a tasteful way without being too trashy or too prudish.

If you read the first two books, you simply must get around to making your way through this one!

Robin Woods' third installment in the *Watchers Series* is an adrenaline-pumping race to the finish! For me,

the ultimate test of any book has always been the extent to which I am unable to put it down. "The Sacrifice" had me hooked from beginning to end, so much so that it has been my constant companion for the last few days. One of the things that impresses me the most is the depth and continuity that Woods has shown throughout this trilogy. Plot details and characters from the previous two books are not only featured in "The Sacrifice", but they also act as vital elements of the narrative rather than as afterthoughts. This is a truly satisfying conclusion to the Watcher series. Conflicts and questions are dealt with, but nothing feels contrived or forced. Everything plays out naturally, and the best compliment I can give is to say that I stopped thinking about Woods' characters as literary figures and couldn't help but think of them as people: real human lives that I cared about and wanted to succeed.

"The Sacrifice" is delightfully complex. At no point does it fall prey to the all-too-easy trap of multiple-book series; it never gives the impression that the author is grasping for enough material to fill another book. In fact, it is quite the opposite. Everything from "The Unintended" through "The Nexus" has steadily built upon itself to prepare readers for "The Sacrifice", which then takes what we have already learned and runs with it at 90 miles-an-hour. It is so rich in detail that I now want to go back and re-read the first two books in order to see with fresh eyes how it all fits together. "The Sacrifice" is fast-paced, heart-wrenching, and poignant, and above all a fantastic conclusion to an incredibly strong debut series of novels.
