It's a fun and quirky roller coaster ride from

there as Heather--not looking for love at all--quickly finds her heart entangled with Peter's, while overcoming her own guilt, grief, and Facebook naysayers, all while navigating the tricky waters of introducing a new man into a family of grieving children.

Julie does an amazing job getting the reader invested in the outcome of Heather and Peter's love affair. We hold our breath while they splash into unchartered romantic territory for them both, sigh a big awwww while Peter does crazy, romantic things to woo Heather and her kids, and jump up and down applauding when Heather gets her very unique, unexpected, and humor filled HEA. Although Julie could've really turned the screwdriver and punched readers in the gut with lots of sadness, the story is actually quite uplifting, funny, tender, and realistic from Heather's perspective as a single mom dealing with every day mama drama.
