Leslie Langtry is back with another Merry Wrath story that will have you chuckling throughout the book. If you recall the last book and the girl scout troop's trip to Washington DC, Merry and the troop attracted a woman named Evelyn Trout who nobody knew and wasn't anyone's mother. Since the "real" troop leader, a very pregnant Kelly, was left behind in *Who's There, Iowa*, Evelyn's unknown connection wasn't discovered until they reached home. Merry may have been a terrific CIA agent, but her ability to learn names leaves something to be desired. With the plan to make sure Merry knows all the moms and girls, Kelly schedules a lock-in at the church for the troop and their moms. Fortunately (as Merry sees it) two girls are sick, so there will only be 10 sets of names to learn. When Merry discovers the 4 Kaitlins all have mothers named Ashley, she is overjoyed and doesn't bother to sort out last names, but refers to them as the Kaitlins and the Ashleys. So many things happen at the sleep over, including the girls dying Merry's bangs pink as well as Philby (her cat that looks like Hitler) a matching pink all over. There was also the reappearance of Evelyn Trout.

Meanwhile there are new characters (like the new coroner named Dr. Body), new villains (Red and Blue), a "dumb" cop who spends all his time eating while on the job, and Agent Savage who is a height challenged FBI agent. Riley (Merry's former CIA handler) moves into Merry's house and the fun continues as they save the world-well at least a little bit of Iowa called *Who's There*.

I laughed out loud at some of the things Merry thought about! From start to finish this was an enjoyable book that was over way too soon. You won't want to miss this episode in Merry's exciting life!

How does Merry get into so many scrapes? Although a minor character, her dad is such a great guy. The girls in the troop are smart beyond their years. And Merry's sidekick (aka Troop Leader) Kelly has her own problems--a new baby and a husband who doesn't understand where diapers go.
