I would give this a solid 4 stars, although I felt it was too short...rushed at the end.

The story is about a graduate student, Sierra, who wins the chance to be THE PA to the Speaker of the House (let's suspend reality for a moment because this would NEVER happen in real life. Maybe a low level assistant...also her duties like having one on one dinners with him wouldn't either...but in fiction world things like this happen). She, of course, has a sassy gay friend, who I felt we didn't see enough of.

Marcus is the young Speaker of the House (32...which is super young to get that kind of political clout in this day and age) and, of course, super hot. He happens to be engaged.

Despite all of this SOUNDING semi-contrite, it actually was quite good. The dialogue wasn't forced. I flew through the story; I didn't want to put it down. Mild emotional turmoil over one of Sierra's former lover.

This is a MILD Dominant/Submissive type novel. When I say mild, I mean...they refer to it a lot...he TALKS about it a lot...he asserts himself in a verbally aggressive manor, but it didn't take on the form of s&m...at least not in THIS novel (part 1).

Things I had some problems with:

- The strange non-marriage pre-nup
- The fast-forwarded ending, although I am appeased by a promise of a second book. :-) A lot of the details are just kind of left out and rushed.
- It was not clear how a grad student could just pick up and leave campus for months to move to DC. Is it summer? If so, how does she keep her dorm room?

Overall, a really good, fresh story with some steeaaaaamy love scenes that will have you fanning your kindle screen. Can't wait for book 2

I haven't read too many books that have political fiction as a theme, but the few I have read, I know that (as

an avid reader), they need to be good to grab my attention. I had no doubt, having read a lot of Becs books before, that it would be. I fell for the characters immediately, and even though it's a shorter read and it's fast paced, I wanted MORE immediately. I love how at the beginning of the book, Marcus--the alpha male "speaker of the house" was all dominant, short spoken, and somewhat rigid, and by the end, he was almost desperately vulnerable. Some people don't like the insta-love aspect in books, but seeing as how I read for pleasure and to escape from everyday life, if the book is written well, it doesn't bother me a bit. If I wanted real life books, I'd write my own or be an autobiographical junkie.

I loved the two main characters connection, and you could literally feel the steam rising off the kindle...and to have that all wrapped up in a political story, was awesome.

My only two areas of warning are: yes, there is a cliffhanger, but you're assured by the author, there will be resolution and a HEA in the 2nd book (which shouldn't too much longer until released); and yes, there is cheating. That is a hard limit for some avid readers, and while in real life, I don't condone it, and in book life, it causes me angst induced heartburn, the cheating in this book wasn't without "reason". When you read the book, you'll see what I'm saying. I actually encouraged the cheating because of the back-story of the characters involved. Now, if this was real life, I'd be handing out some judgements. With that said, I've read PLENTY of other books where GOOD people in NORMAL circumstances were cheated on, and it all but made me need nerve pills!

Bottom line, this book is up your alley if you like erotic novels with a storyline that isn't being played out right now. More than that, I've found that you can't really go wrong with a Bec Botefuhr read...she roped me in with several of her series books, and I have yet to be disappointed!
