First of all, were I a kid I would go "Bleh!" But I'm not so here's the long version.

Kylie Summers is being stalked. Typical taller-than-average, long blonde haired damsel in distress. I least I think she was said to be blonde. I don't even remember and when I scanned the first three chapters, I either missed it or it's not listed. How bad is it that I can't remember but I'm visioning her as a blonde like the rest of the known romance dansels? Anyhow, the girl is jumping at shadows and acting like a crazy person because someone is 'stalking' her, aka coming to all her demos with a hooded face, leaving her creepy phone messages, leaving notes in her bible of all things, and posting her personal info online. This warrants her first move in the book? I don't think so.

Nate is your typical ripped, sandy-haired (found that while looking for HER hair color), damaged goods, mysterious romance hero who is emotionally in tune with himself AND Kylie. He owns a restaurant that he's thinking of selling and lives in one of two apartments above it. With luck the second one is vacant (if you want to make money instead of sinking money into your restaurant, you should rent it out, no? Get someone else to pay the bills on the place) so miss Summers can move right in. Oh and he conveniently owes her brother a favor.

This book was full of little things that bugged me. Things like cliché sayings (eg: as skittish as a cornered cat), and phrases that made me roll my eyes. Also, this was the most preachy book I have read in a good long while and I have been reading an awful lot of Christian Fiction as of late. I admit that it wasn't too blatant as to beat you over the head with religion, but I don't believe for a second that there are a lot of people out there that think and talk like these two religious people. Nuhuh, can't convince me.

The saving grace of this book was the fact that the ending was just the realization of two characters that they might be in love with each other. While I disagree that a week or two together mixed with high pressure situations should result in a teen-like love conversation of "I do love you!" "I do love you too!!!" which summons up the main part of the story. I should have stopped reading there...but I didn't.

The epilogue after the main story is only 8 months later and our two new love birds ARE ALREADY MARRIED!!!!

Pet peeve #1 of all my reading pet peeves is unrealistic romance timelines that end in marriage. He must have proposed the day after the book ended, because I don't know about you, but everyone I know had to book their wedding revues at LEAST a year in advance. Even all those lovely people who had backyard weddings took over a year to get everything together.

KEEPING GUARD is one of Ms. Barritt's suspenses, and if you like that type of book, it will keep your heart pumping. I'm kind of glad that the hero wasn't the what-seems-like-mandatory-for-this-line FBI agent or police officer, but instead, an ex-military man, eking out a normal life for himself in a small town. That was a major plus. He is kind-hearted, if a little grumpy at times, and willing to do anything for his best friend (Kylie's brother) even "babysitting" a scared-out-of-her mind heroine.
