What a fun book! After moving home to Charm, NC, Everly buys the home of her dreams and turns it into a luncheon cafe serving organic food and a variety of ice tea. As a favor to a high school friend, Everly hosts and caters her wedding at her North Carolina beachside home. The wedding goes off without a hitch, until the groom disappears during the reception and Everly stumbles on his body near the shoreline. It's a whodunnit with several red herrings thrown into the mix of suspects.

Light mystery, romance and beach reading, this is a great book for fun, uncomplicated reading. The characters are fun and quirky - Everly's aunts remind of the aunts in Alice Hoffman's Practical Magic, but the subject is not quite as intense. It's a sweet read without aggressive language or overly illicit or romantic language. The setting of the novel is charming (which is unsurprising, given that the town's name is Charm), the characters are interesting, and the whodunnit mystery will keep you guessing until the end. Everly Swan is an assertive amateur detective without being obnoxious about pursuing leads, meaning that she is invested in solving the crime but makes reasonable attempts to keep herself out of avoidable danger. (It's so annoying when novels create suspense by having the protagonist make obviously terrible decisions.) The lead detective, Grady, is likable, and the electricity between him and Everly is fun to watch unfold. This is a great series for cozy fans.

I really like Everly and her iced tea shop--frankly, it's probably good for my own eating habits to not have every mystery I read revolved around someone who owns a cupcake or pancake shop! I like that she's trying to fit back in to her hometown and build her dream life. Even though the trope of a baker/chef/tea-maker going back to the town she grew up in and opening a little business has been done a ton in recent years, something about this feels a little fresh. Everly is kind, and she feels like a friend.

You have to suspend a LOT of disbelief as a reader to understand how she could possibly run a business and do the things she does in the book. One day, she runs her cafe/tea shop by herself ALL day as well as investigates the murder and watches all the audition videos in the contest her aunts are taking part in. Right.
