First sentence: From the moment his baby sister arrived, the *Boss Baby* had a feeling that change was in the air. The first thing the new executive did was outline her business plan and restructure the organization from the top down.

Premise/plot: The *Boss Baby* LOSES his position as THE BOSS, THE CEO, when his baby sister arrives. "The CEO was bossier than the *Boss Baby* had ever been. Which seems impossible." He does not react well to the new baby, OR, to the fact that his parents ADORE the baby beyond all reason. What can he do to get their attention?! What won't he do might be the question. (Parents be warned, illustrated bums are shown!)

My thoughts: Loved this one too. The ending is especially clever. I liked seeing the *Boss Baby* and the *Bossier Baby* brought together by the end. I loved the personalities in this one. Babies do have personalities right from the start, and, no two babies are alike. For better or worse. The parents do seem a bit more relaxed this time around. (And one scene seems to hint that they are enjoying a couple of 'adult' drinks.)

Marla Frazee dabbles with the emotions of older siblings feeling out of place when a baby comes into the family due to the lack of attention they receive from their parents. While the illustrations are detailed and elaborate such as showing the “bossier baby” in pearls and fancy apparel the vocabulary choice isn’t very kid friendly. Upon discussing the perks and privileges the baby receives Marla uses words such as Organic catering services, aromatherapy, stress management, afternoon spinning among other things. While adults can laugh and understand the metaphoric humor kids wouldn’t and would just be able to enjoy the pictures. You have to read this series as sarcastic social commentary. This is a tongue in cheek look at what it is like

Notes on content: There's a spread where the former boss decides to take extreme measures to get attention, including stripping down in public and urinating on a flower bed. (Only a baby butt shown.)
