Another seton recommendation and I loved it. This is such a marvelous HP, the theme is the same but the treatment is really good. Dione is a dutiful daughter(like in all HP's) to her jerk of a father, who is a bully and disliked by all, he even separated her from her mother when she was 6 and divorced her, jerk as I said. He has a heart-attack and then asks Dione to go to his biggest enemy Theo for monetary help. Seriously, why she loved this jerk of a father I didn't get, she refuses first but then the step-mother starts begging. So, she goes to Theo who is surprised to say the least and in typical HP fashion likes the heroine and wants to marry her. They get married but Dione puts some stipulations, it will not be a "real" marriage and shall last only 12 months.

Now, why I loved it, Theo is an amazing hero and not a jerk, he falls for Dione the first time he sees her and treats her well, of course he tries to seduce her but when she says no he listens and when he takes her virginity he feels bad. He actually tries to woo her, talk to her, look-after her. In the middle of the story we get to meet Dione's ex-boyfriend and Theo's ex-wife, who in typical HP fashion are not likable people. Dione is a good heroine though she irritated me at times with her attitude towards her father but she stands up for herself finally, she tells her hospital ridden father "you sold me", you GO GIRL!!I also felt she blew too hot and cold sometimes with Theo but hey only we knew what Theo(from his POV) felt for her, the thing she knew was that he was blackmailing her. She doesn't melt over Theo, fights with him, ignores him, not like those HP females who seem to forget that the heroes are blackmailing them The book is awesome!Seton you have good choice:)
