

This would be a great read aloud because the students would love the comical pictures. Boynton does a great job depicting even difficult opposites. For example the right and wrong opposite was done with pigs and a telephone. The right and wrong aspect is done by whether they are holding the telephone correctly. The color palette used is mainly primary colors and each page is different. I would recommend this book for preschoolers and kindergartners.
