

The historical romance series Devil Ryder begins with The Devil's Daughter and continues in The Devil's Defiance.

In The Devil's Daughter, Blaze Marie Austin is an outlaw with a past. She is working on the Broken Circle, the ranch owned by James Ryder and his sons. The relationship between Ryder and his sons is strained at best, but Blaze feels that she owes James her life and stays on, hiding her past and trying to help him catch the rustlers that are plaguing his cattle herds. Warren, the eldest, suspects Blaze of being part of the problem, but Blaze's real fight is with Gade. A bounty hunter and the second son, his history with his family sent him running, and he's come back for what he swears is the last time to help save the ranch. Sparks fly rather predictably between Gade and Blaze.

In The Devil's Defiance we focus on the youngest Ryder brother, Garrett and his romance with Sophia Maria Osbourne, daughter of a corrupt judge. We pick up where the first book left off, with the villain in custody and Garrett in charge of both delivering him to San Antonio to stand trial and acting as the prosecuting lawyer. But when the villain escapes, and takes the judge's daughter with him, Garrett gives chase, determined to bring him to justice and save his childhood sweetheart. If by childhood sweetheart you mean that girl he kissed one time when he was 12. While The Devil's Daughter is slightly better than Devil's Defiance, both of them suffer from the same problems. There are original ideas, but they are difficult to find in the mess that makes up the bulk of the story. The heroines even share their middle name.

The books could definitely use some editing. They are weighed down by the tropes that plague many romance authors. The characters act in ways that make no sense – including going on

pointless side trips that take you away from the action. There are interesting moments, but they are lost in the mess of poorly thought out motivations. Attempts to prolong the tension between characters leave your floundering as you feel like you've missed a major plot point. Even the love scenes are awkward and poorly timed, or perhaps I simply don't understand the romance of sexing it up in a stream where someone may try to shoot me at an..ahem...vulnerable moment.

There were glimmers of potential here. The books are not a slog – they go down easy and are fast paced. While I did not especially enjoy these two books, I feel like I would give the author another shot. Better editing, both in terms of streamlining the plot and watching for typos would go a long ways towards setting these books on the right track.
