

A Gem That Needs More Polishing

The first thing: this is a good story, and I want to see more from this author. The story, world, characters, and magic are all new and interesting, and draw you in. The spell-checking and general editing is well done too. Nice. So having said all that, here's why the very best I can give it is 3/5: Discontinuity.

Maybe it's just me, but the MC's emotions and postures are all over the place: I simply can't get a feel for the guy. One minute he's strong and dedicated, the next he waffling, then he's taking a jerky hard line. Bizarre. The first couple of times it happened it was so jarring I re-read the text a few times, sure that I missed a scene, then sure one got dropped in rewrites. It's like the first sex scene: it happens, but we (I?) really don't understand why it happens. It's technically well written too, but you kind of scratch your head over it.

Multiply that by the dozens, then add in similarly inconsistent behavior by the other characters, and you're left saying "Wait, what?" so many times that the story is lost. That's a real shame, because like I said first thing, this book is good: as blueprinted, anyway. If it's updated, with some transition scenes (hell, even

sentences!) added, and character behavior solidified, then you will have a solid winner here. As it stands though, as much as I want to like it — and I DO want to like it — I just can't recommend it right now.
