None of the other books did (nor did the "sneak peek" at the first few chapters of book 6 included with the download of book 5) ... they all would simply state the location that chapter would take place (which was helpful as the chapters did skip focus among many different characters). For some reason, this slight change threw me just a bit. I'm not sure, but in this book it felt a little more like we were left hanging more often as the chapters would end and the focus would shift.
