Kirby is a shape-shifting spider monkey who doesn't like the idea of being tricked into mating, but upon meeting Amery changes his mind pretty quickly. The two men give into their attraction and have mating sex. Cue HEA and the end, right? Wrong. Seems Kirby did not know that male witches can get pregnant and now his new lover and mate is up the duff. Conflicts arise over this little nugget, then add in the fact a person from Amery's past tries to tear them apart and you have plenty of conflict.
