However, for how good the concept is for this series, there are some problems with the delivery. I will mention the lack of editing in this books, misspelled words, missing words and so forth. However, these things are kind of expected these days in ebooks in the sub \$9.99 category. These are first time authors that are not making the needed money for professional editing.

The misspelling and minor editing problems are one thing, but there are a few somewhat major plot problems. These are details that result in an author maybe taking on a storyline structor that is a little too grand. Here I even found a character getting killed even though he was already killed the previous book. There are situations popping up that were never a problem before but suddenly they are. Just over all details that just done fit properly.

I think most of these flaws are because the author is still fairly new, he has the raw talented needed to be a great story teller, he just needs the experience to fine tune his craft.
