

That said I had a hard time reading this book in the beginning. There aren't a lot of reviews out there because it is so new and I really wasn't sure what to expect. As the summary on the back cover and elsewhere tells us it's a story about a lot of people and how their lives come together, and it's kind of dark. So... you have to meet those characters and get to know them. In the beginning this was very overwhelming to me. The author doesn't separate their stories with chapter breaks, he does it with **** so you will be reading about Samantha and Megan and the *** you are reading about Ira and Betsy. It threw me at first. I got mad and put the book down. Eventually though I picked it up again and as the story went along I guessed what the connection between Megan and Ira would be. As the connections were formed I was more drawn into the story, but it's necessary to get through those backgrounds first or else the story doesn't make any sense. By the time I got deeper in to it I was having a hard time putting the book down, and I was thinking about the characters even when I wasn't reading (always a good sign of a good book).

In the end, I felt like he pushed Samantha's character a little too far. Her story was plenty awful but at the start of Chapter 11 her story takes a turn that I felt was unnecessary. It's not my story to write but it would have still been a good book without that scene.

The book ends with a lot of things left unanswered, but life is a journey so I suppose that's how it should be. I think not knowing what happens to some of the characters is kind of the point because in life things can go in so many different ways, and this book is only a snapshot to show us how these characters to connect. What happens afterwards isn't really what the story was about. It does wrap up the story for some of them though, and for those it's a good thing. And the fact that I'm wondering what happened to these fictional characters after the book ended tells me that Kevin Zdrill did a great job of making their stories real.
