While I was willing to cut the whole werewolf thing some slack, the reason that I didn't like this was that the mix of humour and drama just felt too uneven for me and simply didn't work for me. Plus, the pacing was weird and I couldn't *feel* the two of them (or even just one of them) fall in love. Jiro was certainly cute, and Kaya your typical seme-type person (oh, that reminds me, the fact that there's switching was a point in favour of this one, but not enough to make up for the rest), but I didn't particularly like either of them.

It wasn't terrrible - the art certainly was very good - but it left me cold.

Wonderfully drawn. This is not a wolfy menage but a romance between Jiro (the younger wolf brother) and Susugi (the cafe owner/gravekeeper). Jiro looks human but with different colored eyes and pointy years and a veeerrrry bushy tail (he has to hold it out of the way so Susugi can fuck him). Jiro and Tarou have been kicked out of their pack by their father and are so hungry that they break into Susugi's cafe and eat his food. When they have no money to pay, they proceed to move in with Susugi to 'work off' the debt. Susugi is rude to the brothers but long-suffering, putting up with klutzy Jiri breaking his dishes and the wolves mooching off him, even brushing Tarou, who is in his wolf form most of the time and retains a wolf's head when in human form. And so Susugi isn't so alone anymore...

There are adventures with grave robbers and angry ghosts but this is at heart a love story.

The chibies are also super cute.

I found the digital version well formatted - I bought this on Kobo and read it on a Kobo app on my ipad. It reads back to front (swipe left). The pictures were easy to enlarge and looked focused even when enlarged. I had no issues scrolling or resizing.

Not for the Faint of Heart - Three Wolves Mountain Vol 1 Review

Well back to the yaoi this week with Three Wolves Mountain, found on amazon and purchased now that there really isn't anything to get at the local bookstore. In some ways it is a sad fate, to not be able to find anything in town, to have to wait for things to arrive from the vast and mighty internets. But at the same time there is the fact that selection in the book store is quite limited, and selection online is equally vast and mighty. Which means that, drunken pineapple playing glorious music through my veins, I embark into a yaoi that is actually satisfying visually and imaginatively.

It's a strange thing (to date, at least) to find a mature (read sex-themed) manga that actually manages to tell a decent story while being naughty and fun. But I am extremely happy to report that Three Wolves Mountain manages to be entertaining, charming, sweet, funny, cool, and pretty damned sexy. It's good times all around. For those looking for a book that really succeeds in capturing both humor and a bit darkness and wrapping a sweet coating of sex around it, look no further. The story itself follows two brothers, both werewolves, as they search for and find a home with a human. It is an interesting premise, as one of the werewolves is mainly human while the other is mainly wolf (they have full moon versions that move toward traditional werewolves, but I liked the difference). They are kicked out of their home by their parents and are taken in by the human guardian of a graveyard.

And the stories are all solid, all fairly dark and definitely mature, and each growing the relationship between the more human werewolf and the human. They make a cute pair and along with the wolf brother become something of a family. This is while dealing with ghosts, family, and demonic possessions. It all just works, all just feels right. And while it is an aspect of the human's backstory, there is no actual rape in this volume. For a yaoi, that's basically unheard of, but here we get only consensual sex, only two people engaged in a loving relationship. And while the two characters aren't always perfect with each other, it works. I got the sense, at least, that these characters were fun and existed in a world larger than the one shown.

And, of course, the sex scenes are great. Probably out of all the adult manga I have read so far, this had the best art, the most detailed, and given that some of these characters have fur at times, that's really saying something. The scenes are steamy and well done, and there isn't really anything to be uncomfortable with. Here are two people in love, and finding out what it means to be in love. There's no censoring, no blurring or anything like that, and this is the first yaoi I've read where the guys are not locked into roles of who is the top and who is the bottom. And, somehow, that seems refreshing.

So yes, highest recommendations for Three Wolves Mountain. The drunken pineapple cries out in joy as it is crushed between my teeth and all is, for once, right with the world. The one real downside to this is that there is only the one volume, only the one set of stories. A part of me desperately wants more, wants to be able to keep following these characters. But I suppose I shall content myself with other stories, other naughty adventures, and know that at the very worst I have found a very good read. A 9.25/10.

This story is dumb but mostly harmless.

It started pretty fast, as we got insta-sex in the first chapter already, but at least it was explained because Jirou was in heat during that time. But was it necessary that Koya was abused by his brother and said brother was also abused? That Koya accepts werewolves just like that, would have been sufficient as an unusual background.

At least at half of the manga this became quite preachy and cliché with its messages and dialogues. In addition we got the old problem that love relationships don't actually develop, and the same with the other relationships, so that everything here simply happens or you get told about it. Quite bad narrative style. Which probably also explains why so many questions remain open, e.g. when Jirou's and Rarou's mother is called Erika, does that mean she is German? Do we have the old half-blood trick here?

I read this book because it was about werewolves, but it wasn't the kind of werewolves that I liked. All the werewolves have different kind of powers and different kind of transformations (some only have the ears and tails, some always have a wolf form except when it's the full moon, etc.). Though maybe you should be aware that there's mention of sexual abuse, and that it's drawn (but not to graphic).
