This is the third book in Stephanie Tyler's SEAL series, and it's lived up to and perhaps exceeded its predecessors. In this book, we finally get some action (outside of the bedroom) that I'd expected when seeing that the hero is a SEAL. I enjoyed the characters and the plot. In fact, I especially liked the secondary characters of Ava's brother and her friend, who end up getting together in the story. I only wished their story could have been explored a little further.

Synopsis - Assistant District Attorney Ava Turkowski has dedicated her life to helping abused women, both at work and off the clock. Of course, the men who abuse their wives don't always limit their malfeasance to battery, and her most recent case is tangled up with a family of drug traffickers. Her brother Leo is a DEA agent whose cover is blown when Ava is targeted for helping the abused wife disappear. Leo calls his best friend (and Ava's high school crush) Justin Brandt, a Navy SEAL, to get her out of town.

Justin arrives in time to save Ava from unknown gunmen, but otherwise everything goes wrong. Leo and Ava's friend Callie are both captured in attempt to get Ava to surrender. While trying to stay safe and do whatever they can to help their friends, Justin and Ava have to deal with the events and miscommunications that drove them apart 9 years ago.

Review - I didn't make it to the half-way point. So far the author has placed us inside at least 5 different heads. The gradual revelation of the main characters' history is choppy and teasing (in an unpleasant way). Their emotions are all over the place and I'm having a hard time following the mood swings.

There are some interesting questions and uncommon plot twists. I like the idea of an underground railroad for abused women and the fact that the women seem strong and capable (even if Ava seems a bit emotionally inconsistent). I think Stephanie Tyler has a great imagination, and I would love to read more when her flow improves.

Additional Notes: While this book is technically part of a series, the stories are not especially connected. We see some of the same characters, but these are definitely stand-alone titles.

Justin Brant, a highly trained Navy Seal gets a call from his friend Leo Turkowski with a request. Leo is working undercover to get more information to put the O'Rourke's behind bars. But somehow his younger sister Ava is involved in this case and Justin has to get her out of town fast. Justin cannot refuse this request and is heading to Ava, even though their history together.

Ava Turkowski is working on an abusive case of Susan Mercer, who seems to be connected to the O'Rourke's family. Ava has been treated before, but not like this. So when she receives some photographs of her and the people around her, she knows that she has to leave town. And when Justin appears on her doorstep not long after getting those pictures, she knows she's in big trouble.

Justin takes Ava to a safe house only his Navy Seal members knows about and hopes he Leo will contact them soon with more information. But it seems the DEA has a traitor in their midst and Leo is caught and beaten to death. Can he escape the O'Rourke's and save his little sister or should he let Justin do that job?

Navy SEAL Justin Brandt gets a call from his best friend, Turk, to check on Turk's sister, Ava, because she's in trouble. Justin has always watched out for Ava even when she didn't know it.

Justin broke Ava's heart nine years ago when he left her. She's never trusted another man since. When he shows up at her door when she's in trouble, there is no one other than her own brother she would trust to help her.

I breezed through this book. The chemistry between Justin and Ava is steamy...their history makes things even hotter for them. Most of the story is about them running from "something" but not really meeting up with much. A few things get unexplained, though it didn't detract from the story.

Also introduced in this book are Callie and Leo (Turk). I would have liked a bit more about them. Their part of the story was a little less believable.

What I really liked was the push-pull between Justin and Ava. In some romances, it ends with the characters saying they love each other and that's that...happily ever after. This one was more...love isn't always enough. They've always loved each other, but that doesn't mean it will work. Plus, happily ever after doesn't mean that it isn't difficult or scary.

I read this book without having read either of the 2 previous books - Coming Undone Harlequin Blaze 315 SEAL team Book 1 and Risking It All Harlequin Blaze 327 SEAL team Book 2. The other characters are mentioned and play a part in this book, but it wasn't necessary to have read those books.

I realized as I started reading this that I'd read one of the earlier books in this trilogy and enjoyed it. For the small size, Tyler does a good job of packing in a very tense and exciting suspense plot. Of course this is a Blaze, so you expect the over-the-top sexual attraction and descriptions of tingling body parts. That's okay because you know what you're getting when you pick up one of these titles.

This book was better than average and I enjoyed almost the entire story. I understood Ava's reluctance to get involved with someone with a dangerous job. The author did a good job showing that and not just describing it. But the author lost a star when she couldn't find a way out of that dilemma believably. My eyes started rolling when all the women in these SEALs lives get together for a mutual admiration meeting where they comment on each others awesome awesomeness. And then they explain to Ava how they cope with the stress of having husbands who might never come home. (view spoiler)

I have a great deal of respect for the wives and husbands whose spouses put themselves in danger for others. Not just the special forces people, but police, firemen, and all military personnel. I think Tyler might have been able to come up with a way to promote the quiet strength of otherwise "ordinary" people who keep it together and provide that safe place for their spouses while they wait for their safe return.
