Reading two other David Chance stories by John Hileman, "Messages" and "Voices", might be helpful to get the full background for this book, but I can still consider it a fascinating stand alone book. Just enough of Jon

and Chance's history is brought out throughout the book so you're not left scratching your head wondering what the heck he's talking about. Hileman does it cleverly though, with the background coming out in conversation as the story progresses, rather than a lengthy narrative all at once.
