This is a book I will recommend to my book club. It isn't a novel, but a collection of essays about (mostly southern) women who have shaped the lives of six women with whom Paul has maintained an enduring friendship since their college days. To begin with, how wonderful and unusual is it for seven women to make the effort it obviously took to maintain their common friendship bond literally over the decades since going their separate ways across different states, despite the many distractions and changes that accompany careers, children and life? That alone is rare and precious. Based on many conversations over the years, Paul asked each of these friends to record her own story about a woman in her life who had been especially supportive, inspirational, or influential. Then she weaves the essays together with descriptions of how she met each friend, and how the individual relationships with each of them had enriched her own life. Paul bookends these essays with descriptions of her beloved (and obviously special) grandmother, an Irish immigrant with a talent for elevating the everyday to the magnificent.

Kelly Paul is a talented writer. She should try her hand at fiction.
