After losing Mouse to a drive by at the MC three years ago, Sarah has struggled to cope with having a baby on her own and everything that entails ever since. However the MC have not forgotten her and have continued to support her with Bosco assigned to watch over Sarah. However Sarah is a strong and stubborn woman and hides a lot of things to keep that distance from the MC who she blames for Mouse's death. Bosco is just as determined to push past her constraints and show her that the MC is family and looks after its own. When a devastating diagnosis is given, it is Bosco who is mainly there for Sarah but also all of his MC Brothers and their women.

This was an emotional storyline full of heart wrenching scenes, especially with Sarah, Mille and Bosco. I knew from the author's front note that I was in for an emotional time and tissues might come in handy! There were a lot of heart searching, anger and passion to work through for these two to get to their happy ending. It was a slow burn to get there but the trauma of Mille and Rachel were an added depth to the romance storyline.

Both characters were deep and complex which that was due to the author revealing the difficulties and devastation both had dealt with in the past that gave me as a reader a deeper insight to the person they had become.
