First and foremost, I have to say that once I was able to give that novel my full attention, I really got caught into the story. This book is definitely not a typical romance novel and the faint of heart should be warned about the sensitive subjects around which the story is developed. The novel is labeled as contemporary erotic romance, but is also at the crossroad of psychological drama and thriller. It leaves a strong impression and stays with you even after you have finished reading it, which is, in my opinion, a very good thing.

The story has a good flow, likeable protagonists and detestable antagonists. The character's emotions and reactions to events make sense regarding their past. The majority of the scenes, mainly the most intense ones, are particularly well written and we feel that plenty of attention was accorded to them. This is the first novel of this very promising author and I'm positive that she will offer her readers many other great stories in the future.

Lyla, the main female character, has had a rough life. When we first meet her, she has no hope of ever finding happiness and plans to give her career her full attention for the rest of her life. Little did she know that she will soon meet Mr. Perfect (tall, dark, intelligent and rich). The two instantly fall head over heels in love. I first had the impression that the love story was rushed, but I soon understood that their meeting and attraction was not going to be the main plot of the book as it is often the case for a typical romance novel. Of course there are steamy sex scenes and the chemistry between the two is scorching, but those scenes also convey darker and more complex emotions for Lyla who learns to deal with her self-image issues and the demons of her past.

I would have liked to know the main male character, Everett Brown, better. He somewhat seems too perfect and many things remain untold about him and about Lyla. This is to be expected since the book is the first of a series of four. The next book being from his point of view will certainly give the reader a better insight about who he is and the emotions that he went through during the dramatic events that happened to his beloved.

Overall, I highly recommend reading this novel and its sequels.

Having said that, it gets 5 stars from me because of the way the author approached such a taboo subject. I find that in a lot of writing with a similar story line, the writer often skims over the details, leaving a lot of assumption to the reader. Succumbing to Scars and Sorrow did not do that. Details were not ommitted through fear of offence and I think Mary was brave to reveal so much of Lyla Harper's past. She wrote it with sensitivity and respect and it contributed to the reader being able to relate to Lyla. I felt her pain because I had a vivid picture in my head of the suffering she had endured.

We see Lyla at her lowest, struggling to deal with the past and coping the way many of us do - by pretending that everything is okay. It brings Lyla to life - she is not a typical stick thin character with no flaws and a perfect life. She is an every women figure, with a past that affects so many every day. Her display of low self-esteem and lack of confidence made me want to shake her and tell her she was beautiful and strong. Which is exactly what Everett Brown did.
