

If you want to know, what is "wetter than a cat caught in an August thunderstorm" then take a journey into the history of the Montana Territory where men outnumbered women 100 to 1. In this steamy tale you will learn of one woman's trip from back east who rode the Bride Train west to meet her new husband and ended up with three.

Before Amelia Smathers' sister, Prudence dies; she gets Amelia to promise to sign a marriage contract and come west to be the wife of Nevin MacDougal and to raise her sister's baby girl as her own. When she arrives, she soon learns that it is not Nevin, the youngest MacDougal she had married, but Ross the one people call the MacDougal Devil.

Gillis, Prudence's husband, is clan chief of the MacDougal Montana lands ands stands 6'5, big as a bear with red hair everywhere and takes after his highland father -- while his half brothers Ross and Nevin with their dark skin and black hair take after their mother's people the Bannock. Needing a male child to protect their inheritance Gillis signs Ross' name on the contract knowing that this was the only way to marry the MacDougal Devil off.

I was drawn into the plot right away with all the twist and turns and the wild nature of the old west. I was

completely enchanted by Ms. Butler's description of Amelia -- who came across as sweet and innocent but determined to make the most out of her marriage. She's a strong woman with a loving heart but tough as nails when she needed to be. Then you have Ross, Nevin, and Gillis who are pure male through and through but all different in their personalities, which only added to the drama between the pages.

While this book was ok, it left me feeling a little sad!

I read ménage books, because I like to read about the relationship developing between more than 2 people and how that works etc.

I want the relationship to be equal, not to say that between each man and the woman they cannot have their own special connection that is different to the others, but that all are equal.

I felt this slightly in the first book, but thought I would carry on and see how the series panned out, but this one made me feel it even more!

This is not a series about ménage relationships, it is a series about a married couple who "allow" the 2 brothers of the husband into the bed, and the married couple hold all the cards!

I felt in the first book that maybe the relationship was heading toward a more equal footing with the three men and the woman (even despite the woman saying her husband would always be first in her heart) but here, you just know the Husband Ross, is always going to be first in Amelia's heart. It is said in the second to last page pretty much!

That is not what I want or expect from a ménage book. If you want to write this sort of thing, then you need to own it and write about it, a true ménage relationship! And I also loved the whole MacDougal clan and extended family and their small community in Montana territory in 1871. The community is full of interesting character and I'm sure many of them are destined to get their own stories and HEA. I already have my eye on a few characters who have won me over and I can't wait to read all about them. Yup, this is one long smoking hot Western series I can't wait to get my teeth into.

Ross MacDougal is an imposing warrior of mixed Native American and white heritage and you can imagine the prejudice he faced while growing up and still continues to face. Ross is also a man with deep scares who has suffered a lot and the only thing that keeps him going is the idea of vengeance and righting a wrong that shaped his choices and ultimately the man he is. Ross hides his softer emotions and vulnerability under the guise of danger, violence and his savage looks and foreboding mood serves to scare even the most hardened of men. But suddenly he needs to marry, produce an heir (a boy) or him and his brothers will lose the the ranch to their hated brother in Texas. Sadly no decent woman in her right mind will marry a man with a reputation like his, a man known as the MacDougal Devil.

Amelia Smathers is a strong courageous heroine with a big heart who has a lot in common with Ross. On the advice of her dying sister, she signs a marriage contract binding her to the calm sweet younger MacDougal brother but instead she finds herself married to Ross, a man whose erotic touch and passionate hunger awakens her own, leading her to discover a whole new world and a side to her character she never even suspected. Amelia will need all her courage, curiosity and passion in order to share herself with the three men.

Nevin MacDougal is the sweet, light hearted brother who loves to tease Amelia and is willing to wait for her to accept him into her life, her body and to also make a place for him in her heart.

I just love Nevin and can't help wishing he had his own story and a heroine to call his own.

Gillis MacDougal, our kilt wearing older brother and Clan Chief was married to Amelia's older sister but

since her death he has become a shell of the man he used to be. He is grieving, lost and without purpose. But slowly Gillis rediscovers his sense of optimism. Looking out for Amelia and being a part of a family gives him a sense of purpose, while awakening more carnal needs.

The plot is mostly about the sexual awakening of Amelia and her deepening emotional connection with Ross.

Although there are several ménage moments between Amelia, Ross, Nevin and Gillis still this story is not a true ménage since our heroine Amelia lets everyone know her husband Ross will always come first in her heart. In fact there was many a time I'd forgotten this was a ménage story since both Ross and Amelia were more like a couple in love who are into kinky lifestyle. This was not surprising since from the beginning, there was a strong attraction and deep emotional connection formed between Ross and Amelia.

I felt sorry for the left out brothers because their presence seem to have been more like an after thought. This story would've been a lot better had the author decided to stick with either a proper ménage M/F/M/M plot were everyone is truly equal both emotionally and sexually or just stayed with the tried and true traditional M/F dynamics instead of trying to have it both ways and ending up in an unsatisfying halfway house. The progress of the story and the ending left me feeling unsatisfied and disappointed.

I just hope both Gillis and Nevin find their own HEA because, as this story stand, these two lovely heroes were left looking like a couple of charity cases who are a guest in Ross's little piece of heaven, and that is a damn shame.

(A lot of this review will sound the same my review of Barefoot Bride for Three since I had a lot of the same thoughts about them. I have edited the points for this particular book.)

Reece Butler has created a very realistic setting. I went to her website and found a wealth of research for this Bride Train series. All that thought and research comes through in her books and is kind of surprising to find in a menage series.

I love the absolute depth of characters in this book and its prequel.

If I could, I'd give this book a 3.5, but due to the intense research and realistic feel of the series, I'll go ahead and swing it toward 4 instead of 3. The four things that prevent me from wanting it to give this book a full 4

star review are as follows:

1. There is a lot of talk of disciplining the woman if she goes against her husband or the "clan leader". Even though this is somewhat playful in nature, it is so much in the book that it starts to bother me. I really don't know think it adds as much to the feel of the book for as much of the book as it takes up.

2. The bride definitely loves one man above the others. She loves his brothers, but its not anywhere near equal. This is more of a problem for me in this book than in its predecessor because its never addressed and is glaring in the end of the book, where she essentially tells him she loves him the most and always will. I felt especially bad for Nevin as he never had a woman of his own to love him most and unlike Gillis before his wife, Amy's sister, died.

3. While you do come to understand the Ross's brothers, their relationship with Amy takes up a lot less focus of the book. This being said, I felt Gil's relationship with Amy was addressed more in depth than Nevin's even though there was never any verbal expression of how he felt towards her. He basically grunts at the end when she asks if he loves her. Not quite satisfactory there. Nevin was almost too benign of a character. While we found out some stuff about him, it almost felt like he could have been anyone.

4. I found it unrealistic that Amy would have found a pillow book with pictures of a woman with three men. I found it very unrealistic that she had fantasies about it before she entered a menage relationship. And since she had those fantasies, I found it unrealistic that up as much resistance to it as she did. I felt that whole part could have just been cut out.

All these things are rather minor in comparison to the great sex scenes and depth of story, especially considering this is a menage romance.
