

In Assassin, Bella's mother dies, forcing her to move from Richmond to Washington D.C. to live with her grandmother. Her grandmother works as a seamstress for the president's wife. Adjusting to her new life was hard for Bella until she meets Steven, a boy who goes to her school. They play and talk together every day. Steven even had access to The White House where he was friends with Mr. Lincoln's sons. Everything was going alright until Steven moved away. They still wrote letters to each other, but things definitely got harder for both of them. Bella then met John Wilkes Booth. Arabella Getchel, commonly known as Bella, is an extremely beautiful girl who has to suffer the shock of moving next door to the White House after growing up in Richmond, Virginia; due to a dead mother and a drunk of a father. However it's not all bad, her grandmother is kind, she has a steady job, and she makes some new friends. For a few years she has a simple, yet peaceful life, but that all changes when she makes one too many "friends".

As you read Assassin you'll find out how the handsomest man in America, a well-loved actor (by fans and quite a few woman) could so quickly become despised by all, including his beloved South. Yet before Wilkes Booth's name is scum he befriends the fair beauty Bella, and that unique and unfortunately fake friendship is what supplies us with a history and thought changing story.

Like a good author should, Anna Myers grabs your attention from the very first page. Splitting the role of narrator between the two main characters, Wilkes and Bella, she keeps your mind turning comparing the two extremely different points of view. Myers portrays Bella's character as one who is telling the story as a heart-felt confession, while Wilkes portrays the image of total and complete confidence.

One of the best things about Myers's writing style is the fact of how much it makes you really think. It makes you realize that the difference between good and evil isn't always black and white. It wasn't Booth's intention to become a hated criminal. He thought he was doing the world a favor by ridding it of the "tyrant" Lincoln. Young, sweet Bella didn't try to aide in murder; she was just suspect to the charms of someone so many had been smitten by before. And after all, doesn't everybody's' views on right and wrong differ? It's really how one perceives another's actions that bring about evil.

Besides good and evil Myers touches upon the timeless value of friendship. It's true friendship that makes everything right in the end, well not exactly right, nothing could do that; but friendship definitely makes it better. Through friendship the characters are developed, and through strengthening or weakening those bonds the story is unraveled. While something as seemingly elementary as a good friend might seem out of place in a story about a horrible murder, it finds it ways in through the daily interaction of the character's lives. Another reason why I so strongly suggest Assassin is for the history itself. While Bella may be a fictional character, Lincoln and Wilkes Booth are certainly not. The whole Lincoln family plays a part in the book, from one of the young children, Willie Lincoln, who befriends Bella, to the somewhat temperamental Mrs. Lincoln who Bella makes dresses for. The pain and the suffering of the time period play a major role in the story. And Myers keenly stresses that as she takes you back in time to experience the pain of a loved one's funeral or the unimaginable joy gained from the magical sounds of the bells declaring the wretched war to be over.

Learn the stories untold, the secrets not whispered, the undiscovered feelings of a crazily handsome and maybe flat out crazy killer. Assassin by Anna Meyers is a must read for everybody looking for a good book. It's full of thrills, romance, betrayals, lies, friendship, hardships, times that make you laugh, and times that make you cry.
