

They don't call Banshee Creek "the most haunted town in America" for nothing. But Elizabeth plans on changing that reputation, and it starts by taking down the hunky Gabe Franco any way she can.

A Ghost of a Chance by Ani Gonzalez is an easy-breezy-teasy kind of romantic tale. There's plenty of flirting going on in these pages, and a cute story that casts the Elizabeth and Gabe in opposing camps. They're not supposed to be fraternizing, but it's more fun being friends than enemies. And even more fun

being lovers, but everything is conspiring against them. Then there's Gabe's reluctance to become involved with his departed best friend's sister. It just seems wrong, but Elizabeth doesn't think so.

The story is well-written and the plotline inventive. Told in a He said, She Said way, the premise adds a lot of fun and gives Ms. Gonzalez plenty of space to come up with outrageous situations. The only thing I didn't like was the repetitious nature of some of the passages. It doesn't happen once the story gets going, but in the beginning, it does and slows things down.

The humor works as do the characters, especially Liz and Gabe. I liked the chemistry and their personalities and you have to in these types of stories. You can feel the heat and it's only a matter of time before one of them surrenders, or will they? That's what Ms. Gonzalez has us reading to find out.

If you want a fast-paced, easy read that's full of romance and humor, pick up Ghost of a Chance. May the Spirits Be With You! 3.8 stars from me.

Ghost of a Chance is book two in the Banshee Creek series. It is a standalone story that also connects nicely to Must Love Ghosts that came before it. This time the spotlight has moved to Cole's sister Elizabeth and one of his best friends, Gabe Franco.

Elizabeth went through a Goth state and a clumsy stage, but crushing on Gabe was apparently not a phase because she's still not over him years later when they both come back to Banshee Creek. Elizabeth left her mediocre acting jobs out in LA to help her depressed mother save her real estate business and Gabe's mom has guilted him into a visit and to purchase a house in the area along with a chance to check up on his local business investments. Too bad Gabe's business investments involve shoring up the paranormal frenzy which is killing the real estate business for Elizabeth who is working to get rid of the paranormies as she calls them. Attraction flares and both might have to scrap their plans if they can get past their reasons for not wanting a relationship.

It was a fun and feisty battle of wills and some hijinks as Elizabeth pushes to get rid of the paranormal stuff that fuels tourism, but not purchases of haunted houses and businesses. She also can't resist trying to sell one of those homes to billionaire Gabe who won't let her sexy legs and vixen smile talk him into a bad business deal. They both really like to have their way in things and they don't see eye to eye on much so it was quite the battle of wills.

There is also a tender aspect to their romance. Both are still grieving Cole's death in their own ways and both have some family trouble that stunts their ability to trust and commit- Elizabeth especially after her stuffed shirt, stuffy dad cheated on her mother and left the family. This was definitely full of humor with all the crazy small town antics and even their own antics, but the layer of their pasts balanced that.

And then we have the spicy hot sexy romance. Elizabeth may have trust issues and Gabe with his all business and plans, but man, they don't hold back once they get going. It was meant to be a fling, but it morphs into more as they are thrown together so much.
