

This is a great informational book for young readers because it has a fictitious story line, but also provides the reader a great deal of information on penguins. It creates an enjoyable experience for learning. For readers that began with The Magic School Bus series picturebooks, these chapter books are a great introduction into lengthy books and informational text. The font is larger than a novel, making it easier to read. There are smaller illustrations every few pages. The informational text is highlighted in a bold rectangular box, or it shows the students writing on what looks like lined notebook paper. I give this book five out of five stars because it lets readers enjoy their fantasy books all the while they are also learning with

the fun characters.
