The story was full, abounding with pertinent descriptions of the Native American culture. Straight Flies The Arrow by Sydney Betts is an epic historical Christian Native American tale and a marvellous end to the trio of books. I really enjoyed it.

The reader has a real treat as they experience life in the 1840's in Native American villages. Here, life is simple, no worldly worries. There is a combining of the traditional way with the new way of I-Am-Creator, as more and more Native Americans hear and grasp His words. "The new spirit produced changes in me." The reader is reminded that in Jesus, we are all new creations.

As Christians, we have the hope of heaven. "I look forward to heaven, where we will never need to part with a loved one again." Our separation is not forever.

Sydney Betts shows how Jesus never leaves us alone. There is a beautiful scene in the novel where Jesus guides a warrior home on his final journey. It bought a lump to my throat and tears to my eyes.

The novel is about sacrifice and a new way of doing things. If we know Jesus, we no longer need to have 'an eye for an eye'. We can leave the judgment and vengeance to God. Our job is to love.

Names are important. They signify character. A change in character or appearance will bring about a change in name. Likewise Jesus gives us a new name. He calls us beloved.

Sydney Tooman Betts' People of the Book series will make God's Word come alive for you in fresh ways. Not only does seeing His Story from the Native American's perspective allow it to be seen with new eyes, but the story itself reflects The Story in its plot and its characters. Perhaps none more in the series than the third and final novel – Straight Flies the Arrow.

While this can easily be read as a standalone, you really will want to read the first two in order to understand book 3 in its full context. Because the story told on these pages brings full circle the story begun in A River Too Deep, showing how one woman surrendered to Jesus can influence generations. As you become caught up in this epic saga (which is easy enough reading for teens and up), you will also become inspired to reflect on the ripple effects in your own life. Whose life has influenced yours? Who influenced that person? And then that person? And so on? And... who are you influencing? A spiritual heritage is sometimes even more precious than a genealogical bloodline, and it's always good to pause from time to time and reflect back on the people who have shaped you.

Bottom Line: Pacing Wolf's and Small Doe's story is emotional and compelling, and it will tear at your heart in every way. The setting wraps around you vividly, and you will experience it as though watching it unfold first hand. These characters are not easily forgotten, and their story will linger long after you've closed the book.

Tension, heartache, love, and loyalty crisscross and weave together in Straight Flies the Arrow, a poignant and absorbing book about revenge, forgiveness and following Christ no matter the cost.

Revered leader Pacing Wolf left his beloved wife Small Doe to hunt for a predator who is attacking and murdering young women, but when the tracking party returns without him, the tribe's chief demands Small Doe observe a period of grief and then take another husband. But she can't let go of the waning hope that he might return or accept the substitute he left in case he didn't return. Can she do what the Sparrow Hawks require of her? Can she discern what path God would have her walk?

I loved this book! The opening pages plunged right into the action, and from there it's like a river swept me away. It's written in such a way that the authenticity of the characters grabbed hold of my emotions, and I effortlessly slipped into their lives and felt the impact of the things that happened to them. Be prepared to run the gamut of emotions with this one!

Bringing another culture to life in a way that is authentic, respectful and comprehensible to those of us who have no experience with that culture takes real talent and Sydney Tooman Betts has done an outstanding job. Showing how the message of Christ impacted that culture – and realizing that it will always have that impact on unreached people – was both exciting and cautionary. There will always be a cost.

This is such a wonderful book. Well written, filled with thought-provoking characters and fascinating settings, it is also chock-full of Scripture woven throughout in a way that is incredibly organic. Sydney Tooman Betts is a gifted author and one to watch.
