

Mr. Thomas wrote a chatty tell-all novel in 1985 of Wall Street, greed, shallowness, and wealthy Philistines, all examined from the point of view of a supposedly clear-eyed, cynical but lovable, world-weary journalist who is torn between his loyalty to a charismatic captain of industry and his disdain for the cultural and moral wasteland he inhabits. The book could -- and should -- be a lot shorter than its 450 dense pages if it spent less time gleefully detailing the various famous paintings, huge houses, expensive furniture, obscene dinners and beverages, and moral lapses of Mr. Thomas's characters, and avoided the frequent descriptions of his protagonist's innumerable sexual conquests. It is interesting to read Hard Money, though, and try to remember the c. 1985 period of which Mr. Thomas writes. I'm not well-connected enough to know how many thinly veiled real people were included in this book, although Mr. Thomas's political convictions are quite clear. Maybe it would be more fun to read if you were in the know. Unfortunately, since some 30 years have passed, the book has lost whatever dishy spice it may have had at the time. I would say if you're looking for a really strong book of this genre, you can't do better than the great Bonfire of the Vanities, in my opinion the standard against which all books of this type should be measured.
