

There is nothing quite like it every time I pick up a LH Cosway book because she makes me feel like a little kid who just entered the candystore, dying in anticipation to have a taste of everything that it has to offer. With <u>Hearts of Fire</u> that strung me along, I definitely came out of the candystore as one damn happy kid and couldn't wait to come back for more! :D

It's no surprise that I've been highly anticipating this read as I was a huge fan of Six of Hearts and with Jay Fields who practically charmed my pants off, I just couldn't contain my excitement meeting his supposedly dead brother and witness a possible reunion for these two. What more with a circus setting that promises some dazzling moments, I was more than ready to meet **Jack McCabe**.

The story starts off with 21-year old **Lille Baker**, a talented artist who lives with her overbearing mother and a dreamer at heart seeking for the right opportunity to break away. That's when the travelling circus comes to town and a chance encounter gifted her an invite to join them, Lille was ready to be whisk away for an adventure that will open her eyes and heart to endless possibilities.

Although meeting Jack didn't have the same effect as I did when I first met Jay, I liked the brooding intensity that lingered within him. A glint of mysterious vibe but yet inviting that makes you want to get to know him even more. And once the fiery walls were taken down, we got a glimpse of the little boy who was robbed of his family love and the demons he'd been fighting.

At times I felt that Lille was a little too naive for her own good, always blindly allowing the goodness in her heart to prevail but again, the author writes her in such a way that doesn't make me want to completely slap her silly. I could understood her need to throw caution to the wind and just live free for once, to embrace the unexpected and to open up her heart even if it meant risking it.

The thing I love most about this author's reads is her characters which are simply imperfect in the best ways. Sure enough they don't always make the right decisions, some a little rash that had me yelling but I still adore them because I know they did it with the best intentions at heart. Put these two polar opposites together, I became an audience of an amazing spectacle because holy hotness, the intensity sizzles and later burst into an inferno of passion that could quite figuratively set hearts on fire. Plus, throw in an amazing entourage that was quirky, lovable and a touch of villainous on the side, it all came about to an entertaining and such an endearing read. My personal favorite of course would be the cameo appearance of one charming illusionist and his companion that had me all giddy and excited! It was such a lovely twist to the read and coupled with the emotionally-fueled scene of the reunion at last, I admit I may have gotten a little teary-eyed.

One thing I love about L.H. Cosway's writing is that her characters are always so intriguing and inviting. And while you know that you are about to read a romantic story, there is a certain level of ingenuity that sets it apart from the others. So far I have **LOVED** every one of her books I have read and **HEARTS OF FIRE** was no different. It was beautifully written in a way that Jack McCabe and Lille Baker stole my heart individually and together.

Hearts of Fire is Jack and Lille's story and is set within the traveling carnival. Both of them have a story of their own. One more painful than the other but both needing validation of themselves whether they realized it or not.

Jack McCabe ~ He was intense. He was sexy. He was scared. Jack has constructed his life in such a way that he would always be alone. His life had been full of pain both physically and emotionally and he swore he would never allow anyone to hurt him again. Jack didn't go looking for Lille Baker. She found him. He didn't want her to see him. But she saw him anyways.

Lille Baker ~ She was a dreamer. She wants to live a colorful life. Her desire is to be an artist, to paint the things she sees and what she feels. She needed freedom from the life that was suffocating her. Lille wanted

to be seen. She was blinded by the beauty she found in Jack McCabe. Someone who was about to give her life some light. So when given the chance to join the circus she took it and never looked back.

"All I could hear was him. All I could smell was him. All I could taste was him. All I could feel was him. All I could see was him." ~ Lille

Being part of the circus was Jack's life. One that he fit into without having to deal with anything more than he chose to. He didn't let anyone into his world where his desires were something he controlled. With Lille things were changing. There was a level of intensity when it came to Jack's desires, the way he wanted to mark Lille as his. When Lille gifted Jack her body **HOLY SHIT**, it was HOT!!!

When Lille made the decision that she was leaving home it was to live her life like she had dreamed to. She knew it wasn't going to be easy being part of the circus but it was a chance she was willing to take. As she made new friends and started to find her place, she also found herself drawn to "Mr. Tall, Dark and Exotic." It's amazing how your opinion of a book can do a complete U-turn by the time it's over. For the first third of Hearts of Fire, I honestly thought I would be writing a positive review. The writing was a little shaky in parts and I think there were a bunch of missed opportunities with regard to the description/atmosphere of the circus, but it was fun, the characters were interesting and it seemed very *different*.

Back when I was enjoying this book, I thought I would start my review with this quote:

"And then he was walking out onto the stage, two long metal torches in his hands, the tips blazing with fire. My skin prickled with awareness, and somehow I just knew I was in for something truly amazing."

Ooh la la, right? If someone had told me at this point just how bad this book was going to get, I may not have believed them. In this NA romance craze, so many books look alike that I find myself doing a double take whenever I discover a book doing something different, in a different setting, with different kinds of characters. This book had that.

Instead of being set in the United States, this book starts in Ireland. When Lille runs away with the circus looking for adventure, independence and an escape from her overbearing mother - she sets off on a trip to France, making new friends and enemies along the way. Like I said before, I think more could have been done with the atmosphere in the book. I can't help myself imagining how much better and more evocative the circus setting would have been if this book was written by someone like Leah Raeder.

Oh well, I still liked the idea behind it. And what I also really liked was the way the relationship between Lille and Jack was developed. The author builds up their trust for one another through banter and then friendship. It was so rare to see a relationship handled this way and I found myself caring for both characters even more because of it.

And then it all went wrong.

Oh dear, where to start. Okay, so first Lille loses all sense of self and finds herself needing Jack to validate her. I actually can't believe this scene takes place:

"You're a great artist, Lille," he said.

What he said had been so simple, and yet it felt like just a few words from him, telling me that I didn't actually suck, had legitimised me. For the first time in my life, I felt real.

Then we get yet another of those scenes where a guy attempts to rape the MC and the love interest turns up to save her. Why is this used in every single NA romance? I swear, it's in almost every single one. Why is rape being used to prove what a big, strong, sexy guy Jack is?

Then there's the crazy, slutty ex who literally threatens to hurt Lille if she doesn't stay away from Jack. Okay, firstly, why does every single NA male have an ex who is an evil nutjob? Are we supposed to compare them to the goodness that is our female MC? And secondly, I find it so strange how all these guys basically cheat

on or dump their ex immediately when this new girl comes along, but this is legitimised in the book by said ex being a violent hellbitch.

And then there's the fact that Jack turns into a violent, mentally abusive ass after they start sleeping together. He seemed a little angsty before, but afterwards his behaviour was terrible. He is angry and violent (towards objects and other people, not Lille), he treats her like a disobedient child and orders her not to go out walking by herself. When she does, he's all like:

He grinds against another woman while she is watching because he wants to upset her. He says things like this:

"Flower," he said quietly. The term of endearment didn't sound the way it usually did. In fact, it sounded a little threatening. "If you lie to me one more time, you won't like what happens next."

This is classic, controlling mental abuse! Before, I wanted them to get together. After, I just wanted her to get as far away as possible.

Oh, and he gets off on hurting women sexually because he was abused by his foster mother. Sounds familiar. *cough*Fifty Shades of Grey*cough*

Though Mr Grey was all about the tie-up and spank stuff. Jack's kink?

"The problem is that it makes me want to pour wax over your skin, press hot matches to your thighs. It makes want to leave marks all over your body until no man can refute that you're mine."

Hearts of Fire is the second book in the Hearts series by LH Cosway and is about Jack, the younger brother of Jay from the first book. If you've read the first book, you know Jay believes Jack died in a fire, but outside forces have kept them apart. Now that Jack has grown up he works for the circus as a fire breather. Lille lives in a small Irish town, oppressed by her mother and yearns for something more. When she's offered a job to work for the circus leaving town the next day, she decides to go with them.

The circus isn't what she expected, it's full of wonderful people and terrible ones. Many make it clear they don't want Lille there, including Jack. But despite this, Lille feels really happy working for the circus, she feels free.

"Why do you call me flower?" "Because when I touch you, you fucking bloom."

LH Cosway is one of those authors I've always been meaning to get around to. I read her book Six of Hearts and enjoyed, as well as her co-written novel with Penny Reid and liked that one too. What a wonderful read this turned out to be! I don't know why I waited so long to read this story. It was magical, refreshing and everything I expected from this author. "*Hearts of Fire*" had my attention from the start. This author with her fantastic storytelling created something unique, a perfect blend of romance and humor, a tale with an enchanting setting, a tale about a man and a woman who find themselves and also find each other, find love.

The story starts off with Lille Baker, a 21 years old girl who loves art. She's an artist herself. However at her mother's behest she's studying for a degree in business. She lives only with her mother who's an awful woman, controlling every aspect of her life. Being an artist, Lille wants to life her life in colors, she wants to be adventurous, to experiment everything, to make mistakes, to live life to the fullest.

Lille gets the chance to escape not only from her mother, but also from a life she doesn't want to live when someone proposes to her to join a travelling circus, 'The Circus Spektakulär'. She knows what she wants - freedom, so she packs and runs away.

Jack McCabe is Jay Fields's (the male main character from the previous installment in the series, "*Six of Hearts*") supposedly dead brother. He's part of the Circus, working as a fire-breather and knife-thrower. His past left him a little damaged. He build high walls around himself, he doesn't trust easy and he's not very accepting.

"In the stories I read, the bad people get what's coming to them. In the real world, that's not always the case."

Lille is drawn to Jack from the moment she lays eyes on him. He seems dark, dangerous, intriguing and Lille would want for something to happen between them. She thinks he will never notice her, so she want at least to be his friend, to know everything about him, to be for him someone he can trust since he's so unworthy.

"I didn't see him as a damaged little boy, I saw him as a unique, wonderful, yet very breakable grown man."

As the story progresses these two get close, they become friends, but they also become something more. While Jack knows he should stay away from Lille, he finds himself drawn to her like a moth to a flame. He simply can't stay away! They are too good together, they complemented each other in every way, so why should they stay away from each other?!

This story was fantastically written and we all can agree how talented storyteller this author is. I simply loved this aspect of the story. I have to admit it didn't wowed me like the previous book in the series, but I really enjoyed it. It was a great solid read, heartwarming, captivating at times and of course full of magic and adventure.

I can't recall a time when I've been more giddy with anticipation than waiting for Hearts of Fire to come out. What I can't recall even more is a time where I felt as giddy as the day L.H. Cosway proposed me to read her new novel back in January.

To be honest, I went with the normal reaction whenever you're given your favorite special treat. **Gluttony.** Yes, I devoured Hearts of Fire in one night.

I couldn't stop reading about Lille's discoveries, and see through her eyes the magic happening at Circus Spektakulär. Better yet, I couldn't stop festering on L.H. Cosway magical world.

This story is a contemporary romance. But it really felt like I stepped in a fantasy realm from page one.

This author does this to me, chances are you'll feel the same. She always comes up with singular settings, unique driven characters and a storyline that invites creativity. You can't stop your mind from wandering on its own.

I'm in love with this book. I absolutely adored reading Hearts of Fire over the last few days. I just didn't want it to end, so my snail pace reading was to some extant deliberate. Overall I would say it was just a really lovely read that hit all the good spots for me. Just a few things you can find in this book: adventure, fantastical elements, a beautiful love story, a little edge, incredible sexual tension, steam caused by fire and scorching hot chemistry; as well as friendship and a lot of heart.

After being slightly disappointed with Six of Hearts I went in with a little caution but I shouldn't have worried. For me L.H. Cosway didn't disappoint one bit with the second instalment in the Hearts series. I was spellbound from the first page and I was eager to go on this journey together with Lille and Jack and Lola and Marina and all the other odd characters we meet along the way.

"Here lies the story of Jack and Lille Two hearts so big and yet so little."

Lille Baker is a dreamer and an artist. She lives with her head in the clouds, dreaming of a adventures and fulfilling her bucket list. Mostly because her reality just doesn't live up to her wishes and is at times rather cruel. Her mother is a rich control freak, who doesn't love herself and who lets all her anger out on her daughter. She supervises her studies, her boyfriends and even takes away most of Lille's wages she earns during her summer job.

But then one day the *Circus Spektakulär* comes into town and with the circus comes **Jack McCabe** - the fire breather, knife-thrower and risk taker. The enigmatic man catches her eye and her curiosity.

And then everything changes.

Lille runs away with the circus!

"Make mistakes, Lille. Walk on the cracks. Break the rules that were made to be broken."

I personally think that Lille is a very sweet heroine. She is good through and through. A little naive, but she has to be to even contemplate entering into this endeavour. No one in their right mind would - or better yet - should just run away with perfect strangers. But she does and to be fair she really isn't all that safe as a woman travelling across Europe with a circus.

I love her for her unusual and amusing way of looking at the world. In that regard she is very child like and innocent. But on the other hand she speaks her mind and when she finds the courage to stand up for herself it is quite beautiful to witness.

Right from the start Jack and Lille have this very intense connection. Mostly based on sexual attraction, but also curiosity and trying to understand the other. Their chemistry is off the charts and being in Lille's head all the time and witnessing her overactive imagination, as well as her out of control libido sure helps to bring that across.

"Life twists some of us in strange ways, ways that shape us to always be alone, and I'm one of them."

Jack on the other hand is for the most part a mystery, not only to Lille but also myself. It takes a good while before you get some glimpses into his past and what's hidden under all the grumpiness. They start out with a cat and mouse play, dominated by Jack's whiplash inducing actions that transforms into a trusting friendship before it becomes anything else. And let me just tell you when it becomes something else...scorching hot...literally!!

Other than the love story, *Hearts of Fire* also tells the story of the hard circus life and its ups and downs. The reasons why some use it as an escape and others just never knew a different way of living. On top of that there are some rather unsavoury characters around and they don't shy away from causing trouble for the whole community.

"Would it make you feel better to know that we all get the same number of hours in a day, days in a year? Some people might be rich and some might be poor, but none of them can buy time. It is one of the fairest systems in the world."

Of course if you read *Six of Hearts* the name **Jack McCabe** might ring a bell. We are indeed talking about **Jay Fields'** dead brother, who is not so dead after all. Which also means there may or may not be a little magician cameo along the way. ;) Who knows?

I have seen a few very mixed reviews for this book, but in all honesty for me it was a heart warming and beautiful read. I devoured every page and I can already tell this will be one of my most re-read books in the future. Escapism at its best. Just the right book at the right time. Also, I loved the chapter titles, they are so wonderful and in the end they made me cry. If you read the book, you know what I mean...
